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AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to health care facilities; defining term; requiring health care facility to grant religious exemption to employees who object to certain immunization; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-725 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. As used in this section, "health care facility" means any public or private organization, corporation, authority, partnership, sole proprietorship, association, agency, network, joint venture or other entity that is involved in providing health care services including a hospital, clinic, medical center, ambulatory surgical center, private physician's office, pharmacy, nursing home, university hospital, medical school, nursing school, medical training facility, inpatient health care facility or other place where health care services are provided.

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1	B. A health care facility that requires immunizations shall be
2	required to grant a religious exemption to any employee who objects
3	to an immunization against influenza upon the grounds that it
4	conflicts with the employee's bona fide religious beliefs and
5	practices.
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
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
