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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to diversion and employment programs;
8 creating the Pay for Success Diversion Revolving
9 Fund; providing for purpose of fund; providing for
expenditures from fund; providing for codification;
and providing an effective date.

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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 510.8d of Title 57, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
17 fund for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to be
18 designated the "Pay for Success Diversion Revolving Fund". The fund
19 shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,
20 and shall consist of all monies appropriated to the Pay for Success
21 Diversion Revolving Fund and monies which may otherwise be available
22 to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for use as
23 provided for in this section.
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1 B. All monies appropriated to the fund shall be budgeted and
2 expended by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for the
3 purpose of funding contracts for diversion programs that have
4 outcomes associated with preventing incarceration, reducing
5 recidivism, reducing public sector costs, and creating employment.
6 Pursuant to contract, the Office of Management and Enterprise
7 Services shall provide payment to nonprofit charitable organizations
8 for the delivery of predefined diversion and criminal justice
9 outcomes. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
10 approve only those contracts that meet the following requirements:

11 1. The charitable organization can provide not less than One
12 Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000.00) in capital to fund the
13 capital necessary to achieve the predefined diversion and criminal
14 justice outcomes;

15 2. The charitable organization can provide verifiable evidence
16 of reduced recidivism and improved employment outlooks for persons
17 completing the program; and

18 3. Persons participating in the diversion programs offered by
19 the charitable organization are not under custody or control of the
20 Department of Corrections.

21 C. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon verification
22 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services that the
23 diversion program was achieved by the participant pursuant to the
24 contract. Once verified, the Office of Management and Enterprise

1 Services shall provide funds, matching those made by the charitable
2 organization, of up to One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars
3 (\$120,000.00). Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon
4 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
5 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
6 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
