



1 for diabetes while at school or while participating in a school  
2 activity. The plan shall be developed by the personal health care  
3 team of each student. The personal health care team shall consist  
4 of the principal or designee of the principal, the school nurse, if  
5 a school nurse is assigned to the school, the parent or legal  
6 guardian of the student, and to the extent practicable, the  
7 physician responsible for the diabetes treatment of the student.

8 B. The diabetes medical management plan shall indicate whether  
9 the parent or legal guardian of the student with diabetes has given  
10 written consent for a school nurse, a school employee trained by a  
11 health care professional, or a volunteer diabetes care assistant, as  
12 defined by Section 1210.196.2 of this title, to provide diabetes  
13 care in accordance with Section 1210.196.5 of this title including  
14 but not limited to the administration of glucagon to a student  
15 experiencing a hypoglycemic emergency.

16 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196.9 of Title 70, unless  
18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 A. A school district board of education may elect to stock  
20 glucagon to treat a student with diabetes who experiences a  
21 hypoglycemic emergency or if the student's prescribed glucagon is  
22 not available on site or has expired. A board of education that  
23 elects to stock glucagon shall adopt a policy that requires:

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1           1. The school district to inform, in writing, the parent or  
2 legal guardian of each student who has a diabetes medical management  
3 plan pursuant to Section 1210.196.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma  
4 Statutes that a school nurse, a school employee trained by a health  
5 care professional, or a volunteer diabetes care assistant, as  
6 defined by Section 1210.196.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes,  
7 may administer, with parent or legal guardian written consent but  
8 without a health care provider order, glucagon to a student with  
9 diabetes whom the school nurse, trained employee, or volunteer  
10 diabetes care assistant in good faith believes is having a  
11 hypoglycemic emergency or if the student's prescribed glucagon is  
12 not available on site or has expired;

13           2. A waiver of liability executed by a parent or legal guardian  
14 be on file with the school district prior to administration of  
15 glucagon; and

16           3. The school district to designate the employee responsible  
17 for obtaining the glucagon at each school site.

18           B. Written consent and a waiver of liability executed pursuant  
19 to subsection A of this section shall be effective for the school  
20 year for which it is granted and shall be renewed each subsequent  
21 school year.

22           C. A licensed physician who has prescriptive authority may  
23 write a prescription for glucagon to a school district in the name  
24 of the district as a body corporate specified in Section 5-105 of

1 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, which shall be maintained at each  
2 school site in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.  
3 Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be construed  
4 as creating or imposing a duty on a school district to maintain  
5 glucagon at a school site or sites.

6 D. In the event a student is believed to be having a  
7 hypoglycemic emergency, a school employee shall contact 911 and  
8 shall contact the student's parent or legal guardian as soon as  
9 possible.

10 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

11 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
12 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby  
13 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
14 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
