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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 683.23, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 683.23. A. The Oklahoma Department of Emergency
16	Management <del>(OEM)</del> may request the Attorney General to institute a
17	civil action for relief, including a permanent or temporary
18	injunction, restraining order, or any other appropriate order in the
19	appropriate district court, whenever any person:
20	1. Violates <u>,</u> <del>or</del> fails <u>,</u> or refuses to comply with any order or
21	decision issued by the OEM Department;
22	2. Interferes with, hinders <u>,</u> or delays the <del>OEM</del> <u>Department</u> in
23	carrying out its duties and responsibilities;

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- 3. Refuses to admit authorized representatives of the  $\frac{\text{OEM}}{\text{Department}}$
- 4. Refuses to permit inspection by authorized representatives of the  $\frac{\text{OEM}}{\text{OEM}}$  Department;
- 5. Refuses to furnish any information or report requested by the  $\frac{\text{OEM}}{\text{Department}}$  to accomplish its duties and responsibilities; or
- 6. Refuses to permit access to, or copying of, such records as the OEM Department determines necessary to accomplish its duties and responsibilities.
- B. The court shall have jurisdiction to provide such relief as may be appropriate. Any relief granted by the court to enforce an order under subsection A of this section shall continue in effect until the completion or final termination of all proceedings for review of such order is made, unless the district court granting such relief sets it aside or modifies it.
- C. Any person willfully violating any rule, regulation, or order of the OEM an emergency management director with authority in that jurisdiction and acting in his or her capacity as such shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or by a fine of not more than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

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1	D. The Department of Public Safety, the Oklahoma State Bureau
2	of Investigation, and the Oklahoma Tax Commission Any certified law
3	enforcement officer in the state shall assist the OEM an emergency
4	management director in the enforcement of any rule, regulation, or
5	order of the OEM emergency management director.
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
