11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.22, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 9.22. The Office of Disability Concerns State
15	Department of Rehabilitation Services shall have the following
16	powers and duties:
17	1. To identify the needs of people with disabilities on a
18	continuing basis and to attempt to meet those needs;
19	2. To serve as a referral and information source for people
20	with disabilities seeking services and for agencies seeking
21	assistance in their provision of services;
22	3. To generate community awareness and support of programs for
23	people with disabilities;

- 4. To advise and assist the Governor and the Legislature in developing policies to meet the needs of people with disabilities;

- 5. To assist agencies in meeting the requirements of Public Law 93-112, and subsequent amendments thereto, as the same pertain to people with disabilities.
- 7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.24, is 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 Section 9.24. The Office of Disability Concerns State
  10 Department of Rehabilitation Services shall be responsible for the
  11 following duties:
  - 1. To carry out the responsibilities of the Governor's Advisory

    Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities;
  - 2. To provide referral assistance, continuing needs assessment and to advise and assist private and public agencies in statewide policy development concerning people with disabilities; and
  - 3. To implement the provisions of Public Law 93-112, and subsequent amendments thereto, as such pertain to people with disabilities.
- 20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.25, is 21 amended to read as follows:
- Section 9.25. The Office of Disability Concerns State

  Department of Rehabilitation Services shall be assisted by the

  Governor's Advisory Committee on Employment of People with

- 3 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.26, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Section 9.26. The Governor's Advisory Committee to the Office
- 6 of Disability Concerns State Department of Rehabilitation Services
- 7 | shall be composed of forty (40) members who shall be appointed by
- 8 | the Governor. Such members shall serve at the pleasure of the
- 9 Governor. Twenty of such members shall be people with disabilities

- 22 | authorized to conduct the Client Assistance Program for the State of
- 23 Oklahoma under the terms of Section 112 of the Rehabilitation Act of

- 10 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.29, is

- 12 Section 9.29. There is hereby created within the Office of
- 13 Disability Concerns State Department of Rehabilitation Services a
- 14 division for "The Governor's Advisory Committee on Employment of
- 15 | People with Disabilities".
- 16 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9.34, is
- 17 | amended to read as follows:
- 18 Section 9.34. The Office of Disability Concerns State
- 19 Department of Rehabilitation Services shall accept, hold in trust,
- 20 and authorize the use of any grant or devise of land, or any
- 21 | donations or bequests of money or other personal property made to
- 22 the Office so long as the terms of the grant, donation, bequest or
- 23 | will are carried out. The Office Department may invest and reinvest
- 24 any funds and money, lease, or sell any real or personal property,

- 1 and invest the proceeds for the purpose of promoting the well-being
- 2 of people with disabilities unless prohibited by the terms of the
- 3 grant, donation, bequest, gift, or will. If, due to circumstances,
- 4 | the requests of the person or persons making the grant, donation,
- 5 | bequest, gift, or will cannot be carried out, the Office Department
- 6 | shall have the authority to use the remainder thereof for the
- 7 purposes of this act. Said funds shall be deposited to the
- 8 revolving fund to carry out the provisions of this act. Such gifts,
- 9 donations, bequests, or grants shall be exempt for tax purposes.
- 10 | The Office Department shall report annually to the Governor all
- 11 monies and properties received and expended by virtue of this
- 12 | section.
- 13 SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 14 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 166.13 of Title 74, unless there
- 15 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. On July 1, 2016, all powers, duties, employees, functions,
- 17 and responsibilities of the Office of Disability Concerns shall be
- 18 | transferred to the State Department of Rehabilitation Services. The
- 19 transfer shall include all equipment, supplies, records, assets,
- 20 current and future liabilities, fund balances, encumbrances,
- 21 | obligations, and indebtedness associated with the Office of
- 22 Disability Concerns.
- 23 B. Any monies accruing to or in the name of the Office of
- 24 Disability Concerns on and after the effective date of this act, or

- any monies that accrue in any funds or accounts or are maintained
  for the benefit of the Office on and after the effective date of
  this act shall be transferred to the State Department of
  Rehabilitation Services.
  - C. The State Department of Rehabilitation Services shall succeed to any contractual rights and responsibilities incurred by the Office of Disability Concerns.
  - D. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
    Services is hereby directed to coordinate the transfer of funds,
    allotments, purchase orders, and outstanding financial obligations
    or encumbrances as provided for in this section.
  - SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 166.14 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Effective July 1, 2016, all administrative rules promulgated by the Office of Disability Concerns shall be transferred to and become a part of the administrative rules of the State Commission of Rehabilitation Services. The Office of Administrative Rules in the Secretary of State's office shall provide adequate notice in the Oklahoma Register of the transfer of such rules, and shall place the transferred rules under the Administrative Code section of the State Commission of Rehabilitation Services. Such rules shall continue in force and effect as rules of the office of the Commission from and

- 1 after July 1, 2016, and any amendment, repeal or addition to the
- 2 | transferred rules shall be under the jurisdiction of the Commission.
- 3 | SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 4 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 166.15 of Title 74, unless there
- 5 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 6 The State Commission of Rehabilitation Services is hereby
- 7 authorized and directed to enter into agreements and to contract for
- 8 | the provision of services and programs pursuant to the provisions of
- 9 P.L. 93-112. Any program providing services pursuant to a contract
- 10 or subcontract with the State Department of Rehabilitation Services
- 11 and receiving funds from the Department or any contractor with the
- 12 Department shall be subject to the provisions of the administrative
- 13 | rules of the State Commission of Rehabilitation Services.
- 14 SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 15 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 166.16 of Title 74, unless there
- 16 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 17 The Commission on Rehabilitation Services shall promulgate rules
- 18 to implement the provisions of this act.
- 19 SECTION 14. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Sections 9.21, 9.23
- 20 and 9.33, are hereby repealed.
- 21 SECTION 15. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.
- 22 <u>SECTION 16. It being immediately necessary for the preservation</u>
- 23 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
