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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-149.3 of Title 70, unless
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. On or before December 31, 2016, each school district board
20	of education shall evaluate the emergency management plan for each
21	school site overseen by the board. The board of education shall
22	review:
23	1. Training activities;
24	<ol><li>Emergency safety exercises;</li></ol>

- 2 4. School visitor policies;

4 6. The coordination of emergency management activities, plans5 and resources with local, state and federal agencies.

B. On or before July 1, 2017, each school district board of
education shall submit to the State Department of Education a report
on the evaluation required by subsection A of this section. The
report shall include recommendations that address the following
topics:

How to improve the existing public school emergency
 management plans; and

13 2. The cost of improvements to the emergency management plans.
14 C. On or before December 31, 2017, the Department shall submit
15 to the Legislature a report on:

The emergency management plans in the public schools in the
 state;

Recommendations on how to improve the emergency management
 plans; and

3. The cost of improvements to the emergency management plans.
 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.
 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
