BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-112B of Title 29, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife
Conservation Code, no resident or nonresident shall assist,
accompany, transport, guide, outfit, or aid persons in the taking of
game for compensation or other consideration in this state without
first procuring a hunting guide license specified in subsection C of
this section from the Director of Wildlife Conservation or from any
of the authorized agents of the Department of Wildlife Conservation.

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- B. The hunting guide licenses provided in this section and the maximum fee for each license shall be:
- 1. Annual hunting guide license for a resident not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00); and
- 2. Annual hunting guide license for a nonresident not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

The Director of the Department shall promulgate the rules necessary for the issuance of the license.

- C. All residents and nonresidents applying for a hunting guide license to assist, accompany, transport, guide, outfit, or aid persons in the taking of game for compensation or other consideration in this state shall:
 - 1. Be eighteen (18) years of age or older;
- 2. Be able to produce a valid license to operate a motor vehicle or other positive proof of identification, age, and residency, and any such license issued shall show such data as well as the date and time of issuance;
- 3. Be able to demonstrate to the Department a certification in the administration of lifesaving first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR);
- 4. Be able to produce to the Department an insurance policy indicating a personal liability coverage of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00); and

D. The provisions of this section shall not:

1. Apply to landowners who provide such services on properties they own;

5. Obtain written permission from the landowner and possess

2. Apply to individuals licensed to conduct hunts in a commercial hunting area;

3. Exempt a resident or nonresident procuring a hunting guide license pursuant to this section from any other hunting licenses as required by law;

4. Allow a hunting guide license holder to conduct business on any land publicly owned or managed by the Department of Wildlife Conservation or the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department; or

5. Apply to lessees of rural land who provide such services on properties leased by such individuals as a farming or ranching business pursuant to Section 951 of Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes or, if they indicated to the landowner or lessor, the primary use of the leased land is agricultural.

E. Any individual issued a hunting guide license pursuant to this section may, upon conviction of violating the provisions of this section or any rule disqualifying guiding as created by the Department, be punished by a fine no less than five times the amount of the license fee for a first offense and no less than ten times the amount of the license fee for a second offense; for any

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    subsequent offense, the Department may have his or her license
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    immediately revoked. The revocation shall be for a period set by
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    the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission not less than one (1)
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    year nor more than ten (10) years. During the period of revocation,
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    the Department shall not issue to the individual any hunting
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    license. For purposes of this section, "conviction" shall mean a
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    conviction in a court of law, a plea of guilty or nolo contendere,
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    the imposition of a deferred or suspended sentence by a court, or
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    forfeiture of bond.
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            The Department shall promulgate any rules necessary to
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    implement the provisions of this section. The Department shall
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    publish a list of licensed guides, species pursued, and hunting
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    locations on its website.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
