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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4668, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Section 4668. On July 1, 2001, there may be established a 4 5 branch of Northeastern State University within the Tulsa metropolitan area. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 6 7 are authorized to make upper division undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Northeastern State University branch 8 9 available as the State Regents shall determine are appropriate. 10 Undergraduate degree programs offered through Oklahoma State 11 University/Tulsa shall not duplicate those undergraduate degree 12 programs offered by Northeastern State University in Tulsa, as 13 determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

14 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall fund 15 Northeastern State University at a level not less than its fiscal 16 year 1998 level, and its Education and General Budget shall be held 17 harmless from reductions in succeeding years.

It is the intent of the Legislature that Northeastern State
University be funded at a level consistent with the average
allocation and allotment of the institutions in the regional funding
tier as established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education.

Beginning with the 2001-2002 academic year, degrees earned at
 Northeastern State University Branch in Tulsa shall be designated as

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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 626.4, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 626.4. State tuition aid grants shall be awarded to all
21	eligible applicants without any limitation on the number to be
22	awarded in any year other than the amount of appropriations
23	available therefor. The institution involved may appropriately
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schedule work to permit recipients to earn the amount of said
 tuition grants.

3 Definitions of full-time and part-time undergraduate and 4 graduate students shall be established by the Oklahoma State Regents 5 for Higher Education.

6 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 626.7, is 7 amended to read as follows:

Section 626.7. A college tuition aid grant shall may be awarded 8 9 annually to each eligible, qualified full-time or part-time 10 undergraduate or graduate student enrolled in a curriculum leading 11 to a degree or certificate in an institution of collegiate grade or 12 postsecondary institution providing a program of training to prepare students for employment in a recognized occupation in Oklahoma 13 approved or accredited by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 14 15 Education or appropriate postsecondary agency in accordance with the following: 16

Eligibility. Each full-time or part-time resident student 17 1. will be eligible to receive a grant in an amount as provided in 18 paragraph 2 of this section. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 19 Education shall determine by rules and regulations the maximum 20 number of semesters a student may be eligible for grants. 21 No student shall be eligible for grants unless the student maintains 22 such minimum standards of academic performance as are required by 23 the institution in which the student is enrolled. 24

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In the event a student for any reason ceases to continue to be
 enrolled during the course of an academic year, the student shall
 cease to be eligible for tuition aid.

2. Amount of grant. The amount of tuition aid grant to any 4 5 student under this act the Oklahoma Higher Education Tuition Act for any semester shall represent a percentage not greater than seventy-6 five percent (75%) of the tuition and enrollment fees normally 7 charged to residents of the State of Oklahoma by the institution of 8 9 attendance. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 10 determine by rules the annual maximum award amount based on an annual assessment of funds availability. The State Regents shall 11 12 not increase the annual maximum award amount unless funding is 13 sufficient to serve at least the same number of students as the previous academic year. 14

For the 2000-2001 academic year and each academic year 15 thereafter, the percentage of aid shall be based on a need analysis 16 system that is consistent with federal student financial aid 17 regulations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 18 set an annual award payment schedule based upon a maximum grant of 19 seventy-five percent (75%) of tuition and fees with grants based on 20 lower percentages of tuition and fees being awarded to students who 21 demonstrate lower financial need. 22

23 Any student who receives an award for the 1999-2000 academic
24 year shall not be denied additional awards because of inability to

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meet the financial standards established in this act as long as
other eligibility criteria continue to be met and as long as the
award status of the student is renewed on an annual basis. The
Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are authorized to
establish procedures to determine the financial need of the student
under the standards used during the 1999-2000 academic year until
the initial degree requirements are met by the student.

8 Financial assistance received under this act will the Oklahoma
9 <u>Higher Education Tuition Act shall</u> be considered as part of a
10 student's financial aid package.

11SECTION 5.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 626.8, is12amended to read as follows:

Section 626.8. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may adopt rules and regulations, prescribe and provide appropriate forms for application and employ such persons, contract for such services and make such additional expenditures as may be necessary or appropriate for effectuating the provisions of this act <u>Section</u> 8 626.1 et seq. of this title.

19 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are hereby 20 authorized to determine priorities for participation in this tuition 21 aid program by based upon factors including but not limited to full-22 time, or part-time enrollment status, undergraduate and or graduate 23 students enrollment status, unmet financial need, continuous 24 enrollment, nearness to completion of a degree or certificate, state

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1	employment needs, eligibility for other state and institutional
2	student financial aid and based on available state funding.
3	SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
4	SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
