The appointing authority of agencies participating in the 3 D. statewide information systems project may establish unclassified 4 5 positions and appoint unclassified employees to the project as needed. Additional unclassified positions may be established, if 6 7 required, to appoint an unclassified employee to perform the duties of a permanent classified employee who is temporarily absent from a 8 9 classified position as a result of assignment to this project. All 10 unclassified appointments under this authority shall expire no later 11 than December 31, 2007, and all unclassified positions established 12 to support the project shall be abolished. Both the positions and appointments resulting from this authority shall be exempt from any 13 agency FTE limitations and any limits imposed on the number of 14 unclassified positions authorized. Permanent classified employees 15 may request a leave of absence from classified status and accept an 16 unclassified appointment and compensation with the same agency under 17 the provisions of this subsection; provided, the leave shall expire 18 no later than December 31, 2007. Employees accepting the 19 appointment and compensation shall be entitled to participate 20 without interruption in any benefit programs available to classified 21 employees, including retirement and insurance programs. Immediately 22 upon termination of an unclassified appointment pursuant to this 23 subsection, an employee on assignment from the classified service 24

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1	shall have a right to be restored to the classified service and
2	reinstated to the former job family level and compensation plus any
3	adjustments and increases in salary or benefits which the employee
4	would have received but for the leave of absence.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
