COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
An Act relating to building codes; amending Section 1, Chapter 378, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016,
Section 317.2), which relates to church accommodations; modifying definitions; adding certain
requirement for certain purpose; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 378, O.S.L.
2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 317.2), is amended to read as
follows:
Section 317.2 A. The Oklahoma Uniform Building Code or any
building code adopted by any political subdivision of this state, or
any rules or regulations promulgated thereto, may permit the
authority having jurisdiction to allow a church that is occupancy-
rated an A3 building pursuant to any codes adopted by the Oklahoma
Uniform Building Code Commission to utilize its building space for

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1 temporary overnight visitors for the purpose of religious retreats, 2 ministry programs, overnight or lock-in events, emergency or catastrophic occurrences, to shelter transient persons or to 3 4 accommodate displaced persons due to hardship or inclement weather. 5 Such building use shall not constitute a change in code occupancy rating, purposes or activities. Provided, any temporary overnight 6 7 visitor space utilized by a church within its existing buildings as authorized by this section shall be authorized only for a limited 8 9 duration, unless the Governor has declared a state of emergency or 10 exigent circumstances exist. The church acting pursuant to the 11 provisions of this section shall not charge for its accommodations 12 nor be deemed a bed and breakfast, hotel or motel for any code 13 occupancy rating purposes.

B. Churches which temporarily accommodate overnight visitors as provided in this section shall have one of the following:

16 1. An automatic sprinkler system in the area of overnight 17 accommodations that is monitored by a third party; or

2. A hard-wired stand-alone fire and smoke alarm in the area of
overnight accommodations in addition to an exit door <u>or window</u>
opening directly to a public way, exit court or yard area.

C. Nothing in the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code or any code adopted by any political subdivision of this state, or any rules or regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, shall be construed to cause a church to be in violation of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code or any building code adopted by a political subdivision of this
 state for the sole reason the church offers temporary overnight
 visitor services within the authority of this section.

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D. As used in this section:

5 1. "Church" means a facility that is owned by a religious
6 organization and that is used primarily for religious services;

7 2. "Religious organization" means any church, seminary, 8 synagogue, temple, mosque, religious order, religious corporation, 9 association or society, whose identity is distinctive in terms of 10 common religious creed, beliefs, doctrines, practices or rituals, of 11 any faith or denomination, including any organization qualifying as 12 a church or religious organization under Section 501(c)(3) or 501(d) 13 of the United States Internal Revenue Code; and

14 3. "Temporary" means no more than seven (7) consecutive days, 15 accumulating to no more than forty (40) seventy-five (75) days in a 16 calendar year.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017. SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
