Provided, any temporary overnight 10 11 visitor space utilized by a church within its existing buildings as 12 authorized by this section shall be authorized only for a limited duration, unless the Governor has declared a state of emergency or 13 exigent circumstances exist. The church acting pursuant to the 14 15 provisions of this section shall not charge for its accommodations nor be deemed a bed and breakfast, hotel or motel for any code 16 occupancy rating purposes. 17

B. Churches which temporarily accommodate overnight visitors as

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C. Nothing in the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code or any code adopted by any political subdivision of this state, or any rules or regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, shall be construed to cause a church to be in violation of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code or any building code adopted by a political subdivision of this state for the sole reason the church offers temporary overnight visitor services within the authority of this section.
