SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1701 of Title 47, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 As used in this act: 19 "Driving automation system" means hardware and software that 20 are collectively capable of performing part or the entire dynamic 21 task on a sustained basis. The term driving automation system is 22 used generally to describe any system capable of level 1-5 driving 23 automation, as specified in SAE International Recommended Practice 24

- 1 J3016 including, but not limited to, core vehicle functions as 2 listed in this section.
 - B. "Dynamic driving task" means all of the real-time operational and tactical functions required to operate a vehicle in on-road traffic, excluding the strategic functions such as trip scheduling and selection of destinations and waypoints and including without limitation:
 - 1. Lateral vehicle motion control via steering;
 - 2. Longitudinal vehicle motion control via acceleration and deceleration;
 - 3. Monitoring the driving environment via object and event detection, recognition, classification and response preparation;
 - 4. Object and event response execution;
 - 5. Maneuver planning; and

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- 6. Enhancing conspicuity via lighting, signaling and gesturing.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1702 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. Only the State of Oklahoma may enact a law or take any other action to regulate the operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation systems in Oklahoma.
- B. 1. Pursuant to subsection A of this section, the State of
 Oklahoma preempts the authority of a county or municipality to
 prohibit, restrict or regulate the operation of motor vehicles

1	equipped with driving automation systems on the basis of those
2	vehicles being equipped with driving automation systems; and
3	2. Supersedes any existing law or ordinance of a county or
4	municipality that prohibits, restricts or regulates the testing or
5	operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation
6	systems.
7	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective in accordance with
8	the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma
9	Constitution.
