6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public finance; providing
8 definition; requiring legislative approval for
9 certain pass-through spending by state agencies;
10 enumerating pass-through spending items; providing
11 for codification; providing an effective date; and
12 declaring an emergency.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2401 of Title 62, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. For purposes of this section, "pass-through funding" shall
18 mean appropriated state dollars which have been historically
19 allocated to any entity or organization as part of an annual budget
20 and which are not matched by federal funds or set out as a line item
21 in any appropriations bill or legislation.

22 B. For each fiscal year, all pass-through spending items
23 enumerated in the following subsection, not otherwise required by
24 the Oklahoma Statutes or to obtain federal matching funds, by any
state agency shall first be approved by an individual act for each

1 category enumerated in the following subsection passed by the
2 Legislature.

3 C. The following are the categories of pass-through items,
4 containing each pass-through item and the responsible state agency,
5 requiring legislative approval:

6 1. Arts and Tourism:

7 a. Arts Grants; Oklahoma Arts Council,

8 b. Native American Cultural and Educational Authority;
9 Oklahoma Department of Commerce,

10 c. Oklahoma Youth Expo; Oklahoma Department of

19 a. BRAC Protection Military Planning; Oklahoma Department

16 d. Rural Fire 80/20 Grant; Oklahoma Department of
17 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry,
18 e. Rural Fire Coordinators; Oklahoma Department of
19 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, and
20 f. Rural Fire Operational Grants; Oklahoma Department of
21 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

22 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
24

1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
