6 [Oklahoma Clean Air Act - powers and duties of the
7 Department of Environmental Quality - tribal
8 governments - codification - effective date]

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

10 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 27A O.S. 2011, Section 2-5-105, is
11 amended to read as follows:

12 Section 2-5-105. The Department of Environmental Quality is
13 hereby designated the administrative agency for the Oklahoma Clean
14 Air Act for the state. The Department is empowered to:

15 1. Establish, in accordance with its provisions, those programs
16 specified elsewhere in the Oklahoma Clean Air Act;

17 2. Establish, in accordance with the Oklahoma Clean Air Act, a
18 permitting program for the state which will contain the flexible
19 source operation provisions required by Section 502(b)(10) of the
20 Federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990;

21 3. Prepare and develop a general plan for proper air quality
22 management in the state in accordance with the Oklahoma Clean Air
23 Act;

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1 4. Enforce rules of the Board and orders of the Department and
2 the Council;

3 5. Advise, consult and cooperate with other agencies of the
4 state, towns, cities and counties, industries, other states, tribal
5 governments and the federal government, and with affected groups in
6 the prevention and control of new and existing air contamination
7 sources within the state;

8 6. Encourage and conduct studies, seminars, workshops,
9 investigations and research relating to air pollution and its
10 causes, effects, prevention, control and abatement;

11 7. Collect and disseminate information relating to air
12 pollution, its prevention and control;

13 8. Encourage voluntary cooperation by persons, towns, cities,
14 tribal governments and counties, or other affected groups in
15 restoring and preserving a reasonable degree of purity of air within
16 the state;

17 9. Represent the State of Oklahoma in any and all matters
18 pertaining to plans, procedures or negotiations for the interstate
19 compacts in relation to the control of air pollution;

20 10. Provide such technical, scientific or other services,
21 including laboratory and other facilities, as may be required for
22 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Oklahoma Clean Air
23 Act, from funds available for such purposes;

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1 11. Employ and compensate, within funds available therefor,
2 such consultants and technical assistants and such other employees
3 on a full- or part-time basis as may be necessary to carry out the
4 provisions of the Oklahoma Clean Air Act and prescribe their powers
5 and duties;

6 12. Accept and administer grants or other funds or gifts for
7 the purpose of carrying out any of the functions of the Oklahoma
8 Clean Air Act;

9 13. Budget and receive duly appropriated monies and all other
10 monies available for expenditures to carry out the provisions and
11 purposes of the Oklahoma Clean Air Act;

12 14. Bring appropriate court action to enforce the Oklahoma
13 Clean Air Act and final orders of the Department, and to obtain
14 injunctive or other proper relief in the district court of the
15 county where any alleged violation occurs or where such relief is
16 determined necessary. The Department, in furtherance of its
17 statutory powers, shall have the independent authority to file an
18 action pursuant to the Oklahoma Clean Air Act in district court.
19 Such action shall be brought in the name of the Department of
20 Environmental Quality;

21 15. Take such action as may be necessary to abate the alleged
22 pollution upon receipt of evidence that a source of pollution or a
23 combination of sources of pollution is presenting an immediate,
24 imminent and substantial endangerment to the health of persons;

1 16. Periodically enter and inspect at reasonable times or
2 during regular business hours, any source, facility or premises
3 permitted or regulated by the Department, for the purpose of
4 obtaining samples or determining compliance with the Oklahoma Clean
5 Air Act or any rule promulgated thereunder or permit condition
6 prescribed pursuant thereto, or to examine any records kept or
7 required to be kept pursuant to the Oklahoma Clean Air Act. Such
8 inspections shall be conducted with reasonable promptness and shall
9 be confined to those areas, sources, facilities or premises
10 reasonably expected to emit, control, or contribute to the emission
11 of any air contaminant;

12 17. Require the submission or the production and examination,
13 within a reasonable amount of time, of any information, record,
14 document, test or monitoring results or emission data, including
15 trade secrets necessary to determine compliance with the Oklahoma
16 Clean Air Act or any rule promulgated thereunder, or any permit
17 condition prescribed or order issued pursuant thereto. The
18 Department shall hold and keep as confidential any information
19 declared by the provider to be a trade secret and may only release
20 such information upon authorization by the person providing such
21 information, or as directed by court order. Any documents submitted
22 pursuant to the Oklahoma Clean Air Act and declared to be trade
23 secrets, to be so considered, must be plainly labeled by the
24 provider, and be in a form whereby the confidential information may

1 be easily removed intact without disturbing the continuity of any
2 remaining documents. The remaining document, or documents, as
3 submitted, shall contain a notation indicating, at the place where
4 the particular information was originally located, that confidential
5 information has been removed. Nothing in this section shall
6 preclude an in-camera examination of confidential information by an
7 Administrative Law Judge during the course of a contested hearing;

8 18. Maintain and update at least annually an inventory of air
9 emissions from stationary sources;

10 19. Accept any authority delegated from the federal government
11 necessary to carry out any portion of the Oklahoma Clean Air Act;
12 and

13 20. Carry out all other duties, requirements and
14 responsibilities necessary and proper for the implementation of the
15 Oklahoma Clean Air Act and fulfilling the requirements of the
16 Federal Clean Air Act.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-5-105.1 of Title 27A, unless
19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 In preparing any response on behalf of the State of Oklahoma to
21 the federal government on any issue pertaining to the federal Clean
22 Air Act, the Oklahoma Clean Air Act, modifications to air emission
23 standards or any air quality issue, pursuant to the statutory
24 authority granted to the Department of Environmental Quality in the

1 Oklahoma Clean Air Act, the Department shall seek and include any
2 response submitted to the Department by any of Oklahoma's federally-
3 recognized tribal governments.

4 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
