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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2100 of Title 56, unless there
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. This section shall be known and may be cited as the
19	"Automated Community Connection to Economic Self Sufficiency
20	(ACCESS) Act".
21	B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the Department of
22	Human Services shall collaborate to provide for a universal
23	eligibility and enrollment application for:
24	1. The state Medicaid program;

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1	2. The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program;
2	and
3	3. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
4	C. The universal eligibility and enrollment application shall
5	be provided in an electronic format on a cloud-based, commercial-
6	off-the-shelf, software-as-a-service system with native mobile iOS,
7	Android, and web applications.
8	D. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board and the Director of
9	the Department of Human Services may promulgate rules as necessary
10	to implement the provisions of this section.
11	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
