A new section of law not to be NEW LAW 19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 20 There is hereby created, to continue until November 30, 21 2020, the Oklahoma Commission on Obesity. 22 В. 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- 6. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint four members:
 - a. one member of the House of Representatives,
 - b. one member of the public from an rural part of the state,
 - c. one representative of a federally recognized Indian tribe, and
 - d. one representative of a the commercial health insurance industry; and
 - 7. The Governor shall appoint two members:
 - a. one representative of a statewide association of the counties of Oklahoma, and
 - b. one representative of an Oklahoma organization that advocates on behalf of children.
- C. 1. Members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authorities. A vacancy on the Commission shall be filled by the original appointing authority.
- Appointments to the Commission shall be made by October
 2019.
- D. The State Department of Health shall conduct the first meeting of the Commission not later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this act. The chair and vice-chair shall be elected at the first meeting by a majority of those present. The Commission shall be authorized to meet as often as required in order

to perform the duties imposed upon the Commission by law; however, the Commission shall meet at least quarterly.

- E. The Commission shall study, evaluate and make recommendations for any changes to state policy, rules or statutes to better combat obesity in Oklahoma.
- F. The Commission shall prepare and deliver a report of its findings and recommendations for the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and Governor by November 30, 2020. By December 14, 2020, the State Department of Health shall post the report on its website.
- G. Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for serving on the Commission, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:
- 1. State employees who are members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State

 Travel Reimbursement Act:
- 2. Legislative members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 3. All other members of the Commission shall be reimbursed by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for travel expenses

1	incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the			
2	State Travel Reimbursement Act.			
3	H. The Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting			
4	Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.			
5	I. Staffing for the Commission shall be provided by the State			
6	Department of Health.			
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 2019.			
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
