8 An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011,
9 Section 7-101, which relates to voting time for
10 employees; extending days upon which employees
11 allowed time to vote to include days on which in-
12 person absentee voting allowed; requiring certain
13 notification; allowing employer to select days and
14 hours for such time; clarifying language; and
15 declaring an emergency.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 7-101, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 7-101. A. Every corporation, firm, association or
20 individual, hereinafter referred to as "employer", who, ~~on election~~
21 ~~day,~~ has a registered voter employed or in his service, shall grant
22 the employee two (2) hours of time ~~during the period when the~~
23 ~~election is open~~ in which to vote, and if subject to the following
24 provisions:

1 1. Such time to vote shall be allowed on the day of the
2 election or on a day on which in-person absentee voting is allowed
3 by law;

4 2. If such employee be in the county or is at such distance
5 from the voting place that more than two (2) hours are required in
6 which to attend such elections, then the employee shall be allowed a
7 sufficient time in which to cast a ballot.;

8 3. No such employee shall be entitled to such time to vote
9 unless the employee notifies orally or in writing an employer's
10 representative of the employee's intention to be absent, on the day
11 preceding the election day. ~~Upon proof of voting, such employee~~
12 ~~shall not be subject to any loss of compensation or other penalty~~
13 ~~for such absence~~ of the election or the day of in-person absentee
14 voting. Such employer shall select the days and hours which such
15 employees are to be allowed ~~in which~~ to attend such elections, and
16 shall notify each of the employees which days and hours they are to
17 have in which to vote. This section shall not apply to an employee
18 whose work day begins three (3) hours or more subsequent to the time
19 of opening of the polls, or ends three (3) hours or more prior to
20 the time of closing the polls. The employer may change the work
21 hours to allow such three (3) hours before the beginning of work or
22 after the work hours; and

23 4. Upon proof of voting, such employee shall not be subject to
24 any loss of compensation or other penalty for such absence.

1 B. Any employer who fails to comply with this section shall be
2 deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined
3 not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than One Hundred
4 Dollars (\$100.00).

5 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
