7	An Act relating to charities; requiring charitable donation bins and drop site containers to have
8	certain sign posted; stated contents of sign posting; providing period for compliance; setting penalty for
9	noncompliance; authorizing certain seizure and forfeiture for violation; providing for notice of
10	seizure and forfeiture; authorizing sale and deposit of funds from seizure and forfeiture; providing for
11	donation of certain property forfeited; granting certain immunity; providing for codification;
12	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 301.14 of Title 60, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	Charitable organizations using any unmanned donation bins or
21	drop site containers in this state shall be required to have posted
22	on each donation bin or drop site container a sign clearly stating
23	the name of the charity, the state and federal tax identification
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1 numbers issued to such charity, and the address and phone number of 2 the charity's primary business location.

On and after ninety (90) days after the effective date of this act or September 1, 2015, whichever date is the first to occur, no charity shall be permitted to continue using any unmanned donation bin or drop site container without the required sign posting specified in this section.

Failure of a charity to obtain and place the required sign 8 9 posting on each of its unmanned donation bins and drop site 10 containers after the ninety-day period or September 1, 2015, 11 whichever occurs first, shall subject the donation bin or drop site 12 container to removal by the local jurisdiction where it is located. Failure to comply with the provision of this section may 13 additionally subject the charity to an administrative fine imposed 14 15 by the local jurisdiction where such donation bin or drop site container is located. A municipality may seize and forfeit any 16 donation bin or drop site container located in its jurisdiction if 17 such donation bin or drop site container remains without the proper 18 sign posting on or after a ten-day notice of intent to seize and 19 forfeit the donation bin or drop site container is given by posting. 20 The notice shall be posted on the donation bin or drop site 21 container subject to seizure and forfeiture with clear language 22 requiring the charity to either comply with the sign posting or 23 notify the jurisdiction within ten (10) days after the notice 24

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1	posting date. Any seized and forfeited property may be sold and the
2	proceeds deposited in the general fund of the jurisdiction or given
3	to another charitable organization which is in compliance with the
4	laws of this state for charitable organizations. The jurisdiction
5	utilizing the seizure and forfeiture procedure provided by this
6	section shall be immune from liability to the charity and to any
7	person donating to such donation bin or drop site container so
8	seized and forfeited.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
