An Act relating to memorial bridge and highway designations; designating the William Charles "Charley" Coen Memorial Highway; designating the Bud Martin Memorial Bridge; designating the Private Robert "Bob" Clark Memorial Bridge; designating the President Donald J. Memorial Bridge; designating the SGT John Burl Thompson Memorial Bridge; requiring certain markers; amending Section 11, Chapter 369, O.S.L. 2019 (69 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1698.296), which relates to the Councilwoman Avalon Reese Memorial Highway; modifying name of highway; amending Section

12, Chapter 372, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 61, O.S.L. 2015 (69 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1600.1), which relates to requirements for memorial bridge and highway designations; striking certain requirements for memorial bridges and highways; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

SUBJECT: Memorial bridges and highways

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.308 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 64 beginning at the western municipal limits of the town of Buffalo in Harper County extending to N1860 Road shall be designated as the "William Charles "Charley" Coen Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.309 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Turkey Creek in Woodward County approximately two (2) miles east of the Ellis and Woodward County border on Highway 15 shall be designated as the "Bud Martin Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.310 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over the Cimarron River on Highway 15 approximately thirteen (13) miles north of Boise City shall be designated as the "Private Robert "Bob" Clark Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.311 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the section of State Highway 287 beginning at the municipal limits of Boise City extending southeast to the Oklahoma-Texas border in Cimarron County shall be designated as the "President Donald J. Trump Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

The cost associated with signage related to Section 4 of this act shall be paid by the Senate and House of Representatives authors and coauthors of this act.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.312 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 17 beginning at the east municipal limits of Elgin extending to the intersection with NE Miller Street in Comanche County shall be designated as the "Speaker Pro Tempore Jim R. Glover Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.313 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Western Avenue on Interstate 240 within the municipal limits of Oklahoma City shall be designated as the "Medal of Honor Recipient Sergeant John R. Crews Memorial Bridge". The

Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.314 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of State Highway 271 beginning south of the municipal limits of Hugo and ending north of the municipal limits of Grant shall be designated as the "Trooper J.C. Magar Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.315 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Coal Creek located on U.S. Route 75 Business within the municipal limits of Henryetta shall be designated as the "Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient Edward A. DeVore, Jr. Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.316 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of State Highway 56 beginning just west of North Wood Drive extending approximately one (1) mile west through the municipal limits of Okmulgee shall be designated as the "Navy Cross Recipient CPL Russell Keck Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.317 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 20 beginning at the junction of State Highway 20 and N 145th E Avenue in Owasso extending east to the junction of State Highway 20 and S 4080 Road in Rogers County

shall be designated as the "TSgt Marshal D. Roberts Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.318 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 30 beginning at the southern municipal limits of the town of Sweetwater in Beckham County extending south to the intersection of State Highway 30 and County Road 1140 in Beckham County shall be designated as the "Sweetwater Veterans Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.319 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Interstate 35 on State Highway 74 within the municipal limits of Purcell in McClain County shall be designated as the "SSGT Cecil Wellman Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 14. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.320 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Little Skin Bayou on U.S. Highway 64 in Sequoyah County shall be designated as the "Officer Michael Bruce Keen Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.321 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Chouteau Creek on U.S. Highway 77 in Cleveland County shall be designated as the "Tommy Wayne Haley Memorial

Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 16. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.322 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge located on Interstate 44 over State Highway 49 within Comanche County shall be designated as the "MSGT Michael Werdehoff Vietnam MIA Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 17. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.323 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of State Highway 30 beginning at the northern municipal limits of the town of Sweetwater extending north to the intersection of State Highway 30 and E 1060 Road in Roger Mills County shall be designated as the "SP4 Alfred Dean Hildebrand Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 18. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.324 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge located on State Highway 34 over the Salt Fork of the Red River, south of Mangum, in Greer County shall be designated as the "James Amos Callins Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 19. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.325 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The portion of State Highway 51B beginning one-half (0.5) mile west of the western municipal limits of Porter and ending one-half (0.5) mile east of the eastern municipal limits of Porter shall be

designated as the "Lieutenant Eugene Smith Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 20. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.326 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Elk Creek on State Highway 9 located approximately one (1) mile west of Hobart in Kiowa County shall be designated as the "WWII Doolittle Raider - Bombardier Sgt. Robert James "R.J." Stephens Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 21. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.327 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Flat Creek on State Highway 34 located approximately one-half (0.5) mile north of West Madison Avenue near the town of Carter in Beckham County shall be designated as the "U.S. Army PFC Keith N. Cantrell Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 22. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.328 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 82 beginning at the intersection of U.S. Highway 62 and extending southeasterly to the intersection of East Flournoy Road south of Tahlequah in Cherokee County shall be designated as the "Paul Blevins, Jr., and Michael Rogers Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 23. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.329 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:



The bridge over Muddy Boggy Creek on State Highway 43 located approximately one (1) mile east of the town of Coalgate in Coal County shall be designated as the "Stiles Brothers Vietnam Veteran Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 24. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.330 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 69 in Ottawa County beginning at the intersection of Newman Road then extending north to the intersection of Commerce Street in the City of Commerce shall be designated as "South Mickey Mantle Boulevard". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 25. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.331 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 18 beginning at Deep Rock Road and extending north three (3) miles in Payne County shall be designated as the "Terry L. Hoggatt Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 26. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.332 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the bridge over South 129th Avenue on State Highway 51, also known as the Broken Arrow Expressway, in Broken Arrow, Tulsa County, shall be designated as the "Jennifer McClendon Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 27. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.333 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the bridge over Lee Boulevard on Interstate 44 in the City of Lawton in Comanche County shall be designated as the "Maj. Charles E. Stiles Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 28. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.334 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the section of State Highway 28A beginning at the intersection of State Highway 66 near the Town of Foyil extending east to the intersection of Interstate 44 in Rogers County shall be designated as the "CSM Junior H. Honeycutt Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 29. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.335 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge crossing over the Washita River on U.S. Highway 62 located three-tenths (0.3) of a mile east of the H.E. Bailey Turnpike near Chickasha in Grady County shall be designated as the "Ada Lois Sipuel Fisher Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 30. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.336 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the bridge crossing over the Washita River on State Highway 8 north of the City of Anadarko in Caddo County shall be designated as the "Joe W. McBride Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 31. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.337 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of the U.S. Highway 70 Bypass beginning just south of U.S. 70 and extending south and west to the intersection of McLean Drive on the west side of the City of Durant in Bryan County shall be designated as the "Deputy Jarid Taylor Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 32. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.338 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 78 beginning just north of the intersection of State Highway 22 extending northwesterly to the eastern municipal limits of Milburn in Johnston County shall be designated as the "USAF Capt. Nick Karpis Vietnam Veteran Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 33. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.339 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 7 beginning at the north municipal limits of Mill Creek in Johnston County then extending northerly to the Murray County line shall be designated as the "Sgt. Clyde Runyan Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 34. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.340 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The causeway over Old Spiro Lake on State Highway 9 in LeFlore County shall be designated as the "Sgt. Maj. Marvail Lewis Memorial Causeway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the causeway.

SECTION 35. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.341 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 64 beginning at the intersection of E 1040 Road extending northerly to the intersection of E 128th Street in Muskogee County shall be designated as the "County Commissioner Roy Rains Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 36. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.342 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 20 beginning at the intersection of U.S. Highway 75 extending east two (2) miles to the intersection of N Memorial Road in Tulsa County shall be designated as the "PFC Richard Tafoya Gurule Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 37. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.343 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 9 beginning at the intersection of Interstate 35 extending west to the intersection of U.S. Highway 62 in McClain County shall be designated as the "Capt. David Arthur Peters Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 38. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.344 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The intersection of State Highway 66 and Banner Road in Canadian County shall be designated as the "Ray Davis Memorial Intersection". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed at the intersection.

SECTION 39. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.345 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 25 beginning at the intersection of State Highway 2 extending east to the western municipal limits of Bluejacket in Craig County shall be designated as the "Robert L. Horton Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 40. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.346 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 3 West beginning at the west side of the State Highway 19 interchange extending west to the intersection of County Road 1510 in Pontotoc County shall be designated as the "John L. Hayden Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 41. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.347 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the section of State Highway 53 beginning at the intersection of Midway Road extending east through the community of Milo to the intersection of Woodford Road in Carter County shall be designated as the "Creede Speake, Jr. Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 42. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.348 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Honey Creek Pass located on Interstate 35 just south of Exit 51 in Murray County shall be designated as the "W.D. Bill Amis Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall

cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 43. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.349 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 199 from the western municipal limits of Dickson to the eastern municipal limits of Ardmore shall be designated as the "SSG Michael R. Robson Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 44. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.350 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge crossing over U.S. Highway 69 Business located on U.S. Highway 69 at the south edge of McAlester in Pittsburg County shall be designated as the "Carolyn Woods Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 45. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.351 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the section of U.S. Highway 77 beginning at the intersection of Broadway Avenue in Ardmore extending north to the intersection of State Highway 142 in Carter County shall be designated as the "Martin Dyer Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 46. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.352 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 169 beginning at the intersection of East 81st Street South extending north to the south side of State Highway 51 in Tulsa County shall be designated as the "Sgt. Craig Johnson Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall

cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 47. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.353 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the interchange of Interstate 40 and Douglas Boulevard located in Midwest City in Oklahoma County shall be designated as the "U.S. Senator James Inhofe Interchange". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed at the interchange.

SECTION 48. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.354 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 62 beginning at the intersection of N3990 Road extending east through the town of Morris to the intersection of N 4030 Road in Okmulgee County shall be designated as the "Lonnie D. Cook Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 49. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.355 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 75 beginning at the northern municipal limits of Dewey extending north to the southern municipal limits of Copan in Washington County shall be designated as the "Corporal Kyle Jeffrey Davis Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 50. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.356 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over the Fort Smith Stockyards on U.S. Highway 64 west of the Oklahoma/Arkansas state line in Sequoyah County shall be

designated the "Wilmot E. Chamberlain Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 51. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.357 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 283 beginning at County Road East 1660 extending north to the intersection of Tamarack Road in the City of Altus in Jackson County shall be designated as the "Representative Howard Paul Cotner Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 52. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.358 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of U.S. Highway 62 beginning at the intersection of U.S. Highway 270 in the town of Harrah in Oklahoma County extending easterly to the intersection of State Highway 102 North in Pottawatomie County shall be designated as the "Zachary Charles Keever Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 53. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.359 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over old U.S. Highway 64 on Interstate 40 near Muldrow in Sequoyah County shall be designated as the "Deputy Robert L. Criswell Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 54. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.360 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:



Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the flyover bridge located at the U.S. Highway 69 interchange with 9th Street in Calera in Bryan County shall be designated as the "Addie Kate Colvard Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 55. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.361 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the bridge on Interstate 35 crossing over State Highway 33 in Logan County shall be designated as the "Michael W. Johnson, P.E. Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 56. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.362 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the easternmost bridge on State Highway 20 crossing over Skiatook Lake in Osage County shall be designated as the "SGT John Burl Thompson Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 57. AMENDATORY Section 11, Chapter 369, O.S.L. 2019 (69 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1698.296), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1698.296. The section of U.S. Highway 64 Business beginning at ~~West W~~ 23rd Street South extending north to the intersection of ~~West W~~ Southside ~~Blvd.~~ Boulevard in the City of Muskogee in Muskogee County shall be designated as the "Councilwoman Avalon ~~Reese~~ Reece Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 58. AMENDATORY Section 12, Chapter 372, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 61, O.S.L. 2015 (69 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1600.1), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1600.1. Highways, bridges, and other facilities which are part of the state highway system may be considered for dedication in honor of individuals deserving of commendation for their active involvement in the project or for outstanding service to the nation, this state, or their community. ~~Persons proposed to be so honored shall have been deceased not less than three (3) years prior to consideration. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway system designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces, members of law enforcement or firefighters fallen in the performance of their duties. The provisions of this section shall also not apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway system designed to honor Medal of Honor recipients both living and deceased.~~ Proposals for the dedication of state highway facilities should specifically state the accomplishments upon which the proposal is based.

SECTION 59. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021
