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7	An Act relating to all-terrain vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 11-1116, as last amended by
8	Section 2, Chapter 315, O.S.L. 2019 (47 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 11-1116), which relates to operation of
9	all-terrain vehicles; and modifying certain areas in which all-terrain vehicles are allowed to operate.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 11-116, as
14	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 315, O.S.L. 2019 (47 O.S. Supp.
15	2019, Section 11-1116), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 11-1116. A. The self-propelled or motor-driven and
17	operated vehicles described in this section shall be prohibited from
18	operating or shall be limited in operation on the streets and
19	highways of this state.
20	B. Self-propelled or motor-driven cycles, known and commonly
21	referred to as "minibikes" and other similar trade names, shall be
22	prohibited from operating on the streets and highways of this state,
23	except:
24	1. When used in a parade; or

When registered, as required by subsection E of Section 1151
 of this title, and operated in this state by food vendor services
 upon streets having a speed limit of thirty (30) miles per hour or
 less.

5 All minibikes offered for sale in this state shall bear the 6 following notice to the customer: "This machine is not manufactured 7 or sold for operation on the public streets or highways. Since it 8 is not provided with equipment required by law for street or highway 9 use, all persons are cautioned that any operation of this vehicle 10 upon a public street or highway will be in violation of the motor 11 vehicle laws of this state and will subject the violator to arrest."

C. Golf carts and utility vehicles, as defined by Section 1102 of this title, shall not be operated on the streets and highways of this state except:

1. Golf carts or utility vehicles owned by the Oklahoma Tourism 15 and Recreation Department, and operated by employees or agents of 16 17 the Department or employees of independent management companies working on behalf of the Department, may be operated on the streets 18 and highways of this state during daylight hours or under rules 19 developed by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission, when 20 the streets and highways are located within the boundaries of a 21 state park. The Department shall have warning signs placed at the 22 entrance and other locations at those state parks allowing golf 23 carts or utility vehicles to be operated on the streets and highways 24

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of this state located within the boundaries of those state parks. The warning signs shall state that golf carts and utility vehicles may be operating on streets and highways and that motor vehicle operators shall take special precautions to be alert for the presence of golf carts or utility vehicles on the streets and highways;

7 2. The municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance
8 governing the operation of golf carts and/or utility vehicles on
9 city streets; provided, such ordinances shall include necessary
10 vehicle lighting and safety requirements;

3. Golf carts or utility vehicles may operate on state highways only if making a perpendicular crossing of a state highway located within the boundaries of a municipality which has adopted an ordinance governing the operation of golf carts and/or utility vehicles; or

16 4. The board of county commissioners of a county has approved 17 the operation of golf cart and/or utility vehicle traffic on 18 roadways within the county, and:

- a. the roadway has a posted speed limit of twenty-five
 (25) miles per hour or less,
- b. the roadway is located in an unincorporated area, and
 c. appropriate signage, cautioning motorists of the
 possibility of golf cart or utility vehicle traffic,
 is erected by the board of county commissioners.

D. All-terrain vehicles shall not be operated on the streets
 and highways of this state, except:

3 1. On unpaved roads which are located within the boundaries of 4 any property of the Forest Service of the United States Department 5 of Agriculture;

6 2. On highways if:

7 the vehicle needs to make a direct crossing of the a. highway while the vehicle is traveling upon a 8 9 regularly traveled trail and needs to continue travel 10 from one area of the trail to another and, if the 11 vehicle comes to a complete stop, yields the right-of-12 way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an 13 immediate hazard, and crosses the highway at an angle of approximately ninety (90) degrees to the direction 14 of the street or highway. This exception shall not 15 apply to divided highways or highways with a posted 16 speed limit of more than thirty-five (35) miles per 17 hour in the area of the crossing, 18

b. the vehicle needs to travel on a highway in order to cross a railroad track. In that event, the allterrain vehicle may travel for not more than three hundred (300) feet on a highway to cross a railroad track,

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c. the operator of the all-terrain vehicle making the
 crossing at a highway has a valid driver license, and
 d. the operator of the vehicle makes a crossing on a
 highway during daylight hours only;

3. On streets and highways within a municipality if the
municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance governing the
operation of golf carts, utility vehicles or all-terrain vehicles on
streets and highways within the municipality; or

9 4. On roadways within unincorporated areas of a county if those 10 roadways are not part of the state highway system or the National 11 System of Interstate and Defense Highways; provided, however, that 12 the driver is a licensed driver; or

13 <u>5. In a street or highway ditch if the vehicle is operated as</u> 14 <u>close as possible to the outer edge of the street or highway right-</u> 15 <u>of-way. However, no person may operate an all-terrain vehicle in a</u> 16 highway ditch along the interstate highway system.

E. Mopeds, as defined by Section 1-133.2 of this title, may be
operated on the streets and highways of this state if:

The municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance
 governing the operation of mopeds on city streets; provided, such
 ordinances shall include necessary vehicle lighting and safety
 requirements; or

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1	2. The board of county commissioners of a county has approved
2	the operation of mopeds on roadways within the county, not including
3	roadways within a municipality.
