9	annual credit report for youth in custody; reducing age of youth in custody of the Department that shall
10	be provided with an annual credit report; eliminating liability for foster parents for property damage or
11	injuries in certain circumstances; providing certain acts and omissions shall not limit liability;
12	providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 143, O.S.L.
17	2014, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 2015 (10A O.S.
18	Supp. 2016, Section 1-8-111), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-8-111. A. The Department of Human Services shall
20	provide each youth in its custody sixteen (16) fourteen (14) years
21	and older an annual credit report. The Department shall inform the
22	court with jurisdiction over the youth of any inaccuracies in a
23	credit report displaying evidence of identity theft or any other
24	activity fraudulently made on behalf of the youth in custody. The

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Department may implement the requirements of this section in stages beginning with youth in the independent living program whose credit rating may inhibit employment and housing opportunities when the child is no longer in custody.

5 Β. Within one (1) year of the effective date of this act, the Department of Human Services shall submit annual reports on the 6 7 implementation of the provisions of this act to the Chair and Vice Chair of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee and the 8 9 Chair and Vice Chair of the House Human Services Committee. Such 10 reports shall include, but not be limited to, the number of youths 11 in the Department's custody receiving credit score reports, the 12 frequency of such reports τ and administrative issues faced by the Department in the implementation of this act. Such reports shall 13 continue to be issued by the Department until November 1, 2018. 14 A new section of law to be codified 15 SECTION 2. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-9-116.1 of Title 10A, unless 16 17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: A foster parent who is acting in good faith and pursuant to the 18 reasonable and prudent parent standard shall not be liable for 19 property damage or injuries caused by the child or injuries to the 20 child placed in his or her care when the child engages in 21 appropriate activities and such damage or injuries results from the 22 inherent risks typically associated with such activities. Nothing 23 in this section shall prevent or limit the liability of a foster 24

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1	parent if the foster parent commits an act or omission that
2	constitutes willful or wanton disregard for the safety of the child
3	or other persons or their property, and that act or omission caused
4	the damage or injuries.
5	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
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
