Each 21 school district shall have the option of administering the 22 assessments to students in grade twelve in subsequent school years. 23 Subject to the availability of funds, assessments administered 24 pursuant to this section shall be at no cost to school districts. _ _

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C. The assessment-based credential approved pursuant to
subsection A of this section shall be made available to any student
who achieves the required proficiency level on the assessment
administered pursuant to subsection B of this section.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
