7	An Act relating to higher education; providing
8	legislative findings; creating the Oklahoma Higher Education Freedom of Expression and Transparency Act;
9	providing short title; defining terms; prohibiting an institution of higher education from showing bias or
10	favoritism in approving or scheduling usage of institution property; prohibiting an institution of higher education from taking certain actions with
11	regard to student groups; allowing an institution to
12	restrict or deny use of property for certain reason; requiring institutions to publish certain syllabus beginning in cortain academic year; requiring each
13	beginning in certain academic year; requiring each syllabus to include certain information; directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to
14	promulgate certain rules requiring submission of certain information, establishment of certain
15	processes, and reporting of certain information; providing for noncodification; providing for
16	codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
21	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
22	The Legislature finds that:
23	1. Freedom of expression and inquiry at institutions of higher
24 2 -	education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education are

¹ indispensable to the pursuit of educational excellence and the ² furtherance of the ordered individual liberty established in this ³ nation's founding documents;

2. Institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State
System of Higher Education have a duty to promote and defend freedom
of expression and inquiry and the societal consensus on the ordered
individual liberty established in this nation's founding documents
that sustain it;

9 3. Institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State
 10 System of Higher Education should seek and foster intellectual
 11 diversity among administrators, faculty, students, and employees;

4. Positively or negatively incentivizing, informally pressuring, or otherwise compelling students or employees of institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education to embrace divisive concepts is contrary to the mutual respect and collegial processes essential to the free exchange of ideas;

18 5. Measures taken to ensure nondiscrimination cannot be allowed 19 to undermine the principles of merit and excellence in the core 20 activities of institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma 21 State System of Higher Education; and

6. Increased institutional transparency and oversight are needed to lessen the risk of diminished excellence resulting from the imposition or advocacy of divisive concepts.

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1	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3205.15 of Title 70, unless
3	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
4	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
5	Higher Education Freedom of Expression and Transparency Act".
6	B. For the purposes of this section:
7	1. "Divisive concept" means a concept that:
8	a. one race or sex is inherently superior to another race
9	or sex,
10	b. an individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex, is
11	inherently racist, sexist, or oppressive, whether
12	consciously or unconsciously,
13	c. an individual should be discriminated against or
14	receive adverse treatment solely or partly because of
15	his or her race or sex,
16	d. members of one race or sex cannot and should not
17	attempt to treat others without respect to race or
18	sex,
19	e. an individual's moral character is necessarily
20	determined by his or her race or sex, and
21	f. an individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex,
22	bears responsibility for actions committed in the past
23	by other members of the same race or sex; and
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1 2. "Institution of higher education" means institutions of 2 higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher 3 Education.

C. For purposes of approving or scheduling usage of an
institution of higher education's property, an institution of higher
education shall not show bias or favoritism:

7 1. Based upon a guest speaker's or a guest speaker's student-8 sponsoring group's viewpoint, race, creed, color, religion, 9 nonviolent political ideology, or nonviolent political party 10 affiliation; or

11 2. For a student group that, or a guest speaker who, intends to 12 maintain a peaceful campus presence and peaceful use of the 13 institution of higher education's property because the institution 14 of higher education receives threatened simple breaches of the peace 15 or nondestructive disruptions from groups or individuals who oppose 16 the student group's or guest speaker's presence on campus.

D. An institution of higher education shall not:

18 1. Require a student group to pay fees or security deposits
19 that are not charged to all other student groups; or

20 2. Deny a student group access to the institution of higher 21 education's property, if the property is routinely used by other 22 student groups.

E. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection C of this
section, an institution of higher education may restrict or deny use

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of the institution of higher education's property for public displays, organized public gatherings, or public demonstrations if the display, gathering, or demonstration would violate Section 1021 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 To assess the extent to which a divisive concept may F. 1. 6 have been included or has otherwise affected curriculum, beginning 7 with the 2025-2026 academic year, each institution of higher 8 education shall publish a current syllabus for each course offered 9 in the current semester on the institution of higher education's 10 website no later than the seventh business day following the first 11 day of class for the semester.

12 2. Each syllabus published pursuant to paragraph 1 of this
13 subsection shall include, but not be limited to:

14 a. the title and catalog description of the course,

b. the course instructor's name,

- 16 c. the course's required or elective status for relevant 17 majors or general education,
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 d. a brief description of each assignment, examination,
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 lecture, discussion, or other class activity,
- e. the title of each book that is assigned or recommended
 for the course including any textbook or workbook, and
 f. the final grades for the three (3) most recent

semesters during which the course was offered.

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G. To assess the extent to which learning outcomes may have been affected by the inclusion of a divisive concept in the student learning experience, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate rules to require institutions of higher education to submit data and information requested by the State Regents in a standardized format to allow the State Regents to provide an online organized data compilation that details the following:

8 1. The number of students who completed a program at the 9 institution of higher education for the three (3) most recent 10 academic years, disaggregated by underserved minority students; and

Results for students identified in paragraph 1 of this subsection on nationally recognized assessments that assess a student's readiness for postsecondary education, if available to the institution of higher education, and such students' final grade point average at the institution of higher education.

H. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. The rules shall:

19 1. Establish a process by which a student enrolled in or an 20 employee of an institution of higher education may submit a 21 complaint of an alleged violation of the provisions of this section 22 to the institution;

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1 2. Require each institution of higher education that receives a 2 complaint pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection to investigate 3 the report;

4 3. Create a corrective action plan for an institution of higher 5 education that is found to have violated the provisions of this 6 section; and

7 4. Create a reporting requirement for complaints filed, the 8 findings of resulting investigations, and any corrective action 9 plans developed pursuant to this subsection.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025. 11 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 12 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby 13 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 14 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
