Supp. 2022, Section 9204), which relates to the Oklahoma Broadband Office; modifying requirements for 9 assistance provided to the Office by certain agency; requiring fulfillment of certain assistance request 10 by certain date; providing for extension; and declaring an emergency. 11 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 5, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 15 2022 (74 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 9204), is amended to read as 16 follows: 17 Section 9204. A. There is hereby created until June 30, 2028, 18 the Oklahoma Broadband Office, to serve as the state's sole 19 administrator of the functions, powers, and duties assigned to the 20 Office in this act or under law. Effective June 30, 2028, the 21 Office shall terminate and all personnel positions shall be 22 abolished. The Office shall utilize the year prior to the 23 termination date for the purpose of ceasing the Office's affairs.

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1 The Office shall receive administrative assistance from the 2 Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES), which shall 3 provide, through existing OMES resources, administrative assistance 4 upon request in writing or electronic correspondence from the 5 Office's Executive Director, within a reasonable time to allow the 6 performance of the Office's duties or. OMES shall provide 7 assistance in the manner requested within thirty (30) days of 8 determination by the Agency that the request is able to be 9 fulfilled. If for any reason the request cannot be fulfilled within 10 thirty (30) days, the Office and OMES shall enter into a written 11 agreement expressing an agreed upon timeline for fulfilling the 12 needs of the Office. In the event that the request cannot be 13 fulfilled, OMES shall respond in writing within ten (10) days of the 14 request providing reasons why the request cannot be fulfilled the 15 reasoning for denial. If the request cannot be fulfilled utilizing 16 existing resources, OMES may charge the Office for the actual cost 17 to fulfill the request.

- C. The Office shall be governed by the Broadband Governing Board, created pursuant to Section 3 of this act.
- D. The Office shall be advised by the Broadband Expansion Council, created pursuant to Section 4 of this act.
- E. The Office shall have an Executive Director who shall oversee the operations of the Office including, but not limited to:

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- 1. Overseeing the creation, maintenance, and completion of the Statewide Broadband Plan;
- 2. Communicating the state's progress in achieving the goals and implementation of the Statewide Broadband Plan;
- The creation, housing, and updating of a statewide broadband services map;
- 4. Overseeing of grant applications and awards for connectivity and affordability projects;
- Making recommendations to the Board regarding procedural and administrative rules for the Office; and
- 6. Employment and management of Office staff subject to the limitations and requirements of this act and subject to the limitations and requirements of the Broadband Governing Board.
- The Executive Director shall regularly report to the Council and the Board and shall submit an annual report to the Office of the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Office of the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
