AMENDATORY 10 amended to read as follows: 11 Section 3-103. A. The Wildlife Conservation Commission shall 12 constitute an advisory, administrative and policymaking board for 13 the protection, restoration, perpetuation, conservation, 14 supervision, maintenance, enhancement, and management of wildlife in 15 this state as provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code. 16 Β. The Director shall consult with the Commission regarding the 17 administration of the affairs of the Department of Wildlife 18 Conservation. The Commission is authorized and empowered to require 19 from the Director complete reports and information relative to the 20 affairs of the Department at the time and in the manner the 21 Commission may deem advisable. 22 C. The Commission shall meet in regular session at least nine 23 times per year not to exceed one meeting per month with not more 24 than two consecutive calendar months between meetings and in special

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1 sessions as may be called by the Chair or a majority of the 2 Commission. The Commission may hold any regular or special session 3 at any location within this state. Should a location be chosen 4 other than Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City for a regular or 5 special meeting, notice shall be posted at Commission headquarters 6 in Oklahoma City and advertised in the local newspaper of the city 7 in which the meeting is to be held, at least one time during each of 8 the two (2) weeks prior to the meeting. The advertisements shall 9 include time, date, and address of location of the meeting.

D. In addition to the other powers and duties prescribed by law, the Commission shall:

12 1. Institute an affirmative action plan for hiring women and 13 minorities throughout the agency;

14 2. Elect a chair, vice-chair, and secretary, who shall perform 15 the duties required of them by statutes, rules of the Commission, 16 and the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. The chair, vice-17 chair, and secretary shall receive no extra compensation;

Appoint a Director, and determine the qualifications of the Director and all assistants and employees. A Commissioner shall not be eligible for employment in any position within the Department;

4. Prescribe rules and policies for the transaction of its
 business and the control of the Department;

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5. Develop and implement a plan to provide step raises for
 Commission employees so that discrepancies of pay levels within a
 pay grade are eliminated;

Acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or devise, waters, real
property, and personal property incident to the exercise of its
functions and to maintain, operate, and dispose of the same;

7 7. Acquire real property by condemnation only when the Attorney
8 General or other counsel deems it an appropriate means of clearing
9 title from willing or unavailable sellers;

10 8. Supervise the establishment, extension, improvement, and 11 operation of the wildlife refuges, propagation areas or stations, 12 public hunting areas, public fishing areas, game management areas, 13 and fish hatcheries;

14 9. Prescribe the manner of cooperation with the Oklahoma 15 Tourism and Recreation Department, colleges and universities within 16 the state, other state agencies, any agency of the federal 17 government, and any city, town, school district, or any other agency 18 or organization in study of conservation and propagation of wildlife 19 and in the establishment, maintenance, and operation of visual 20 educational facilities, recreational facilities, and hunting and 21 fishing facilities, in the study and propagation of wildlife;

10. Supervise the letting of all contracts and purchases for the Department, with all purchases of personal property to be made through the Office of Management and Enterprise Services;

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1 11. Authorize all claims or expenditures prior to incurring 2 payment except as otherwise provided in this Code; 3 Prescribe rules on the use of Department-owned vehicles by 12. 4 the Director, department heads and other essential employees as the 5 Commission deems necessary in order to perform their duties; 6 13. Prescribe rules for the sale of all regular or special 7 licenses: 8 14. Publicize and encourage the conservation and appreciation 9 of wildlife and all other natural resources; 10 15. Regulate the seasons and harvest of wildlife; 11 16. Promulgate rules to sell fishing and hunting licenses via 12 the Internet; 13 Annually report to the Governor and the Legislature on the 17. 14 complete operation, activities, and plans of the Department, 15 together with such recommendations for future activities as the 16 Commission may deem to be in the best interest of the state; and 17 18. Provide the Governor and the Legislature with an annual 18 inventory of all property and equipment. 19 E. Five (5) years after the effective date of this act, and 20 every five (5) years thereafter, the Commission shall prepare a 21 report for the Legislature with proposed licensing fees based on the 22 latest Consumer Price Index year-to-date percent change release as 23 of the date of the annual average county wage data release from the 24

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Bureau of Economic Analysis of the U.S. Department of Commerce for Legislature approval or rejection.

Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or 8 who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician 9 licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which 10 prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without 11 the assistance of another person, and any one person actually 12 accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise 13 physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This 14 certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing;

10. Nonresidents under fourteen (14) years of age;

16 11. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a Job Corps 17 trainee of this state, provided that the trainees shall have on 18 their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their 19 respective Job Corps Center and shall present the card upon request, 20 in lieu of a fishing license. The trainees shall return their cards 21 to their respective Job Corps Center when the trainees leave their 22 respective Job Corps training programs;

23 <u>12. 11.</u> Any legal resident having a proven disability which 24 renders the resident nonambulatory and confined to a wheelchair as

C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife
 Conservation Code, the nonresident hunting licenses issued pursuant
 to this section and the fee for each license shall be:

Annual hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other than deer, antelope, elk, or bear which expires one (1) year after the date of issuance - One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00) One Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$180.00). Nonresidents hunting big game or combination big game and upland game in a commercial hunting area, gun hunting for deer, or primitive firearms hunting for deer shall be required to have this license;

17 2. The fees from licenses purchased pursuant to the provisions 18 of this subsection shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation 19 Fund to be used exclusively for developing, managing, preserving and 20 protecting wildlife and wildlife habitat.

SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-140, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-140. A. Except as otherwise provided for in this
section, no person may hunt, pursue, trap, harass, catch, kill,

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1 take, or attempt to take in any manner, use, have in possession, 2 sell, or transport all or any portion of any wildlife including fish 3 unless the person has first obtained an Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp 4 from the Director or any authorized agents of the Department of 5 Wildlife Conservation. Each person shall have the stamp in their 6 possession when hunting, fishing, or taking any wildlife. 7 B. Persons exempt from the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp 8 requirements of this section are: 9 1. Legal residents of Oklahoma under eighteen (18) years of 10 aqe; 11 2. Legal residents of Oklahoma sixty-five (65) years of age or 12 older; 13 Legal residents of Oklahoma who have a valid lifetime 3. 14 fishing, hunting, or combination license; 15 4. Legal residents of Oklahoma who have a valid senior citizen 16 lifetime fishing, hunting or combination hunting and fishing 17 license; 18 5. Nonresidents holding a valid nonresident lifetime fishing 19 license; 20 6. Legal residents and nonresidents who have acquired a license 21 pursuant to Section 4-110 or Section 4-128 of this title for fishing 22 in the area of Lake Texoma located within the state; 23 24 _ _

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Nonresidents under sixteen (16) eighteen (18) years of age from states which do not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons under sixteen (16) eighteen (18) years of age;

⁴ 8. Nonresidents sixty-four (64) years of age or older from
⁵ states which do not require nonresident fishing licenses for persons
⁶ sixty-four (64) years of age or older;

9. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent (60%) or more and registered with the veterans registry created by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; provided, that if the veteran has previously received the exemption pursuant to this paragraph, no registration with the veterans registry shall be required;

13 10. Legal resident owners or tenants, their spouses, parents, 14 grandparents, children and their spouses, grandchildren and their 15 spouses who hunt on land owned or leased by them or fish in private 16 ponds on land owned or leased by them;

17 11. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a patient of an 18 institution of the State of Oklahoma established for the care and 19 treatment of mental illness or alcohol or drug dependency or any 20 developmentally disabled person residing in any group home or other 21 institution or developmentally disabled persons when accompanied by 22 an attendant of such institution or legal guardian of said patient, 23 or when fishing on institutional property;

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1 12. Any legal resident or nonresident who is legally blind or 2 who has any other physical impairment, as certified by a physician 3 licensed in this state or any state which borders this state, which 4 prevents the person from properly using fishing apparatus without 5 the assistance of another person, and any one person actually 6 accompanying and actually assisting such legally blind or otherwise 7 physically impaired person while the latter is fishing. This 8 certification shall be carried by the individual while fishing;

9 13. Nonresidents under fourteen (14) eighteen (18) years of 10 age;

11 14. Any legal resident or nonresident who is a Job Corps 12 trainee of this state, provided that the trainees shall have on 13 their persons a duly authorized identification card issued by their 14 respective Job Corps Center and shall present the card upon request, 15 in lieu of a fishing license. The trainees shall return their cards 16 to their respective Job Corps Center when the trainees leave their 17 respective Job Corps training programs;

18 15. Any legal resident having a proven disability which renders 19 the resident nonambulatory and confined to a wheelchair as certified 20 by a physician licensed in this state or any state which borders 21 this state;

16. Any legal resident or nonresident who is fishing with a pole and line, trotline, or throwline in streams, natural lakes, natural ponds, and mine pits when using any bait other than

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1 commercial or artificial bait, blood, stink bait, cut fish, and 2 shrimp; and

³ 17. Any legal resident or nonresident hunting, pursuing, ⁴ trapping, harassing, catching, killing, taking, or attempting to ⁵ take in any manner any species of rattlesnake during an organized ⁶ rattlesnake hunting event or festival and who has a rattlesnake ⁷ permit issued pursuant to Section 4-143 of this title.

8 C. 1. Any fees received for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp
 9 and required to be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund,
 10 created in Section 4-141 of this title and any other money deposited
 11 in the fund, shall be used exclusively for:

12 the payment of bond debt and related expenses incurred a. 13 pursuant to Section 168.9 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma 14 Statutes for the purchase of public hunting, fishing, 15 and trapping areas where the public may hunt, fish, or 16 trap as authorized by law or for the purchase, lease, 17 or purchasing of easements on real property to be used 18 as public hunting, fishing, and trapping areas, and 19 b. the management of the real property acquired pursuant 20 to Section 168.9 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes 21 or acquired with proceeds from the Oklahoma Wildlife 22 Land Stamp fee.

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2. The collection and remittance procedures applicable to
 hunting license fees under this title shall apply to the Oklahoma
 Wildlife Land Stamp fees.

4 The Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp issued pursuant to this 3. 5 section for hunting licenses issued pursuant to paragraph 1 of 6 subsection C and paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection E of Section 4-112 7 of this title and paragraphs 1 and 3 of subsection B of Section 4-8 113 of this title, shall expire on December 31. The Oklahoma 9 Wildlife Land Stamp issued pursuant to this section for hunting 10 licenses issued pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection C and 11 paragraphs 2 and 4 of subsection E of Section 4-112 of this title 12 and paragraphs 2 and 4 of subsection B of Section 4-113 of this 13 title, shall expire on June 30.

D. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
 prescribe, by rule, the form, design, and manner of issuance of the
 Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp and any rules necessary to implement
 the provisions of this section.

18 SECTION 11. REPEALER 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-112, as 19 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 347, O.S.L. 2022 (29 O.S. Supp. 20 2022, Section 4-112), is hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
SECTION 13. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
