BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 35.6.2, is amended to read as follows:

Section 35.6.2. A. In order to comply with Executive Orders 10 and federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements related 11 to interoperable public safety communications and to support the 12 critical mission and purposes of the agencies within the Oklahoma 13 Safety and Security Cabinet, the Transportation Cabinet and the 14 Finance, Administration and Information Technology Cabinet, there is 15 hereby established the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety 16 Interoperability Cooperative. The Land Mobile Radio Public Safety 17 Interoperability Cooperative shall be governed by a committee 18 initially consisting of the Secretary of Finance, Administration and 19 Information Technology or designee, the Secretary of Transportation 20 or designee and the Secretary of Safety and Security or designee. 21 The Cooperative is established to focus on unifying, stabilizing and 22 enhancing the infrastructure and capabilities for land mobile radio 23 public safety system communications for the State of Oklahoma and 24

shall include representatives of other public radio system boards or
 committees along with future voting or non-voting public entity
 members as deemed appropriate, nominated and agreed to by vote of
 the committee members defined in this paragraph.

B. 1. In establishing and operating the Land Mobile Radio
Public Safety Interoperability Cooperative, the committee shall
collaborate with other public agencies, public entities and other
interested parties having public safety radio communications
requirements and resources.

10 2. The Cooperative shall establish an appropriate governance 11 model for determining priorities, leveraging state-owned or other 12 shared services and infrastructure, identifying existing and new 13 resources and directing new investments to facilitate reliable, 14 statewide and fully operational public safety radio communications 15 to serve the purposes described.

In support of the requirements of the Oklahoma Homeland
 Security Act, the Oklahoma Information Services Act and the
 Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act, the
 Cooperative shall have the following duties:

- 20a. enable cost savings to the State of Oklahoma through21unification and enhancement of current land mobile22radio public safety systems,
- b. sustain existing interoperability of land mobile
 public safety radio systems,

c. recommend standards and protocols for land mobile
 radio public safety systems,
 d. recommend standards to become P25 compliant and other
 common radio interoperability standards, and
 e. establish service metrics to ensure reliable land

C. Actions, decisions and operation of the Land Mobile Radio 8 9 Public Safety Interoperability Cooperative shall be performed in 10 compliance with, in support of and secondary to all statutory 11 duties, requirements, responsibilities and authority provided to the 12 Office of Management and Enterprise Services and the Oklahoma Office 13 of Homeland Security; however, the resources and mechanisms 14 available to Cooperative members by ownership or through agreement 15 may be collectively utilized to carry out the provisions of this 16 statute.

17 D. The Cooperative shall create a Statewide Radio Strategic 18 Plan for leveraging existing assets and evolving the technology 19 platform on which the Statewide Interoperable Radio Communications 20 System is based and electronically transmit a copy of the Plan to 21 the respective offices of the Speaker of the House of 22 Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the 23 Governor of this state within ninety (90) days of the effective date 24 of this act. The Cooperative shall implement the Plan in

1 collaboration with all state agencies, political subdivision 2 entities, and other interested parties that maintain a public radio system in this state. The Statewide Interoperable Radio 3 4 Communications Governance Body, created in Section 2 of this act, 5 shall facilitate the interoperability of the radio system of this 6 state. 7 SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.3 of Title 62, unless there 8 9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 10 There is hereby created the Statewide Interoperable Radio Α. 11 Communications Governance Body. The governance body shall be 12 comprised of the following five (5) voting members: 13 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, or 14 designee; 15 2. The Director of the Department of Transportation, or 16 designee; 17 3. The Director of Forestry Services, or designee; 18 4. The Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority Coordinator, or 19 designee; and 20 The Statewide Interoperability Coordinator, or designee. 5. 21 в. The governance body shall elect from amongst the five (5) voting members and the five (5) nonvoting members a chairperson who shall call the first meeting no later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this act. Subsequent meetings shall be at a minimum, quarterly. The chairperson shall have the authority to call meetings as frequently as necessary to facilitate the objectives of the body.

10 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.4 of Title 62, unless there 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 14 to be designated the "Statewide Public Safety Interoperable Radio 15 Communications System Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 16 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 17 consist of all monies designated for deposit to the fund. All 18 monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated 19 and may be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and 20 Enterprise Services for the purpose of awarding grants by and 21 through the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety Interoperability 22 Cooperative for the purpose of implementing and maintaining a 23 statewide interoperable radio communications system, pursuant to 24
