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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2011, Section 24A.5, as
14	amended by Section 1, Chapter 370, O.S.L. 2015 (51 O.S. Supp. 2015,
15	Section 24A.5), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 24A.5. All records of public bodies and public
17	officials shall be open to any person for inspection, copying, or
18	mechanical reproduction during regular business hours; provided:
19	1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, Sections 24A.1 through 24A.30
20	of this title, does not apply to records specifically required by
21	law to be kept confidential including:
22	a. records protected by a state evidentiary privilege
23	such as the attorney-client privilege, the work
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- product immunity from discovery and the identity of informer privileges,
- b. records of what transpired during meetings of a public
 body lawfully closed to the public such as executive
 sessions authorized under the Oklahoma Open Meeting
 Act,
- c. personal information within driver records as defined
 by the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United
 States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725,
- 10d.information in the files of the Board of Medicolegal11Investigations obtained pursuant to Sections 940 and12941 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes that may be13hearsay, preliminary unsubstantiated investigation-14related findings, or confidential medical information,15or
- e. any test forms, question banks and answer keys
 developed for state licensure examinations, but
 specifically excluding test preparation materials or
 study guides;

20 2. Any reasonably segregable portion of a record containing 21 exempt material shall be provided after deletion of the exempt 22 portions; provided however, the Department of Public Safety shall 23 not be required to assemble for the requesting person specific 24 information, in any format, from driving records relating to any

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1 person whose name and date of birth or whose driver license number 2 is not furnished by the requesting person.

The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall not be required to assemble for the requesting person any criminal history records relating to persons whose names, dates of birth, and other identifying information required by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation pursuant to administrative rule are not furnished by the requesting person;

9 3. Any request for a record which contains individual records 10 of persons, and the cost of copying, reproducing or certifying each 11 individual record is otherwise prescribed by state law, the cost may 12 be assessed for each individual record, or portion thereof requested as prescribed by state law. Otherwise, a public body may charge a 13 fee only for recovery of the reasonable, direct costs of record 14 15 copying, or mechanical reproduction. Notwithstanding any state or local provision to the contrary, in no instance shall the record 16 copying fee exceed twenty-five cents (\$0.25) fifty cents (\$0.50) per 17 page for records having the dimensions of eight and one-half (8 1/2) 18 by fourteen (14) inches or smaller, or a maximum of One Dollar 19 (\$1.00) Two Dollars (\$2.00) per copied page for a certified copy. 20 However, if the request: 21

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is solely for commercial purpose, or

b. would clearly cause excessive disruption of the
essential functions of the public body,

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1 then the public body may charge a reasonable fee to recover the 2 direct cost of record search and copying; however, publication in a 3 newspaper or broadcast by news media for news purposes shall not constitute a resale or use of a record for trade or commercial 4 5 purpose and charges for providing copies of electronic data to the news media for a news purpose shall not exceed the direct cost of 6 7 making the copy. The fee charged by the Department of Public Safety for a copy in a computerized format of a record of the Department 8 9 shall not exceed the direct cost of making the copy unless the fee 10 for the record is otherwise set by law.

Any public body establishing fees under this act shall post a written schedule of the fees at its principal office and with the county clerk.

In no case shall a search fee be charged when the release of records is in the public interest, including, but not limited to, release to the news media, scholars, authors and taxpayers seeking to determine whether those entrusted with the affairs of the government are honestly, faithfully, and competently performing their duties as public servants.

20 The fees shall not be used for the purpose of discouraging 21 requests for information or as obstacles to disclosure of requested 22 information;

4. The land description tract index of all recorded instrumentsconcerning real property required to be kept by the county clerk of

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1 any county shall be available for inspection or copying in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Records Act; 2 provided, however, the index shall not be copied or mechanically 3 4 reproduced for the purpose of sale of the information; 5 5. A public body must provide prompt, reasonable access to its records but may establish reasonable procedures which protect the 6 7 integrity and organization of its records and to prevent excessive disruptions of its essential functions; and 8 9 6. A public body shall designate certain persons who are 10 authorized to release records of the public body for inspection, copying, or mechanical reproduction. At least one person shall be 11 available at all times to release records during the regular 12 13 business hours of the public body. SECTION 2.
