14	WHEREAS, nearly 127,000 of the eight million motorcyclists
15	nationwide are riders in the State of Oklahoma; and
16	WHEREAS, motorcycles are a valuable component of the
17	transportation community, as they are fuel-efficient and decrease
18	traffic congestion while having little impact on the state's
19	transportation infrastructure; and
20	WHEREAS, the United States is the world leader in motorcycle
21	safety, promoting education, training, licensing, use of protective
22	gear, and motorcycle awareness; and

1 WHEREAS, the motorcycling community has committed themselves to 2 decreasing motorcycle crashes and fatalities through training, 3 education, enforcement, and increased public awareness; and WHEREAS, following proper safety procedures and being cautious 4 5 of other drivers and riders ensures the safety of Oklahoma's public; and 7 WHEREAS, approximately 56 people were killed in motorcycle accidents in 2014, a decrease from 92 motorcycle fatalities in 2013. 8 9 Due to motorcycle safety training, education, and awareness from the 10 Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, 11 the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, 12 the Edmond and Oklahoma City Police Departments, and ABATE, Oklahoma's number of motorcycle fatalities is decreasing; and 13 WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Administration actively 14 promotes Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, encouraging riders to 15 wear the proper protective and safety gear, never drink and ride, 16 have proper licensing, and to seek proper safety training before 17 taking to the road. 18
