5 WHEREAS, the United States is the world leader in motorcycle 6 safety, promoting education, training, licensing, use of protective 7 gear, and motorcycle awareness; and

8 WHEREAS, the motorcycling community has committed themselves to 9 decreasing motorcycle crashes and fatalities through training, 10 education, enforcement, and increased public awareness; and

WHEREAS, following proper safety procedures and being cautious of other drivers and riders ensures the safety of Oklahoma's public; and

WHEREAS, approximately 56 people were killed in motorcycle 14 accidents in 2014, a decrease from 92 motorcycle fatalities in 2013. 15 Due to motorcycle safety training, education, and awareness from the 16 Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, 17 the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, 18 the Edmond and Oklahoma City Police Departments, and ABATE, 19 Oklahoma's number of motorcycle fatalities is decreasing; and 20 WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Administration actively 21 promotes Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, encouraging riders to 22 wear the proper protective and safety gear, never drink and ride, 23
