L7	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
L 8	2ND SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
L 9	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
20	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
21	the following proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by
22	adding a new Section 8 to Article I to read as follows:
23	Section 8. A. Each person appearing to vote shall announce
24	that person's name to the appropriate election official and shall

- provide proof of identity, whereupon the official shall determine
 whether the person's name is in the precinct registry. As used in
 this section, "proof of identity" shall mean a document that
 satisfies all of the following:
 - 1. The document shows the name of the person to whom the document was issued, and the name substantially conforms to the name in the precinct registry;
 - 2. The document shows a photograph of the person to whom the document was issued;
 - 3. The document includes an expiration date, which is after the date of the election in which the person is appearing to vote. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to:
 - a. an identification card that is valid indefinitely, or
 - b. an identification card issued by a branch of the armed services of the United States to a person who is a member of such branch or is retired therefrom; and
 - 4. The document was issued by the United States, the State of Oklahoma or the government of a federally recognized Indian tribe or nation.

Provided, if the person presents a voter identification card issued by the appropriate county election board, such card may serve as proof of identity without meeting the requirements of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this subsection.

1	B. The Legislature shall have the authority to designate
2	additional forms of proof of identity by law and shall enact such
3	other laws as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this
4	section.
5	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
6	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
7	the following form:
8	BALLOT TITLE
9	Legislative Referendum No State Question No
10	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
11	This measure would enact a new Section 8 in Article 1 of the
12	Oklahoma Constitution. It would require each person appearing
13	to vote to announce his or her name to an election official and
14	provide proof of identity. Certain requirements for proof of
15	identity would be specified. A voter identification card issued
16	by the county election board would also serve as proof of
17	identity. The Legislature would enact laws to implement the
18	provisions of the new section.

22	SECTION 3. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall,
23	immediately after the passage of this resolution, prepare and file
