

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

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Measure Description:

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to establish standards for the collection and disclosure of data related to disability, sexual orientation, and gender identity; selection of downstream health outcome and quality measures; and study of coordinated care organization quality incentive program.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Health Care to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

The measure requires the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to establish standards for the collection and disclosure of data related to disability, sexual orientation, and gender identity. The measure prohibits disclosure of self-funded or employer-sponsored health insurance plans that report health care data voluntarily. Requires the Oregon Health Policy Board to select a minimum of four downstream health outcome and quality measures applicable for services provided by coordinated care organizations. The measure directs OHA to study the coordinated care organization quality incentive program and evaluate the structure of the Metrics and Scoring Committee and provide recommendations. The measure grants the OHA the authority to use other mechanisms outside of global budgets to reimburse coordinated care organizations subject to requirements listed in the measure. The measure declares an emergency and is effective on passage.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

Further Analysis Required
