SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs the CJC to study the OBHDP. The Act directs the CJC to provide the results of the study to the legislature by May 1, 2026. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.7).

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study the Oregon Behavioral Health Deflection Program. Requires the commission to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than May 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to deflection programs.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall study the operation of the Oregon Behavioral Health Deflection Program.
 - (2) The commission shall provide the results of the study, including any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 no later than May 1, 2026.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
