House Bill 2920

Sponsored by Representative NELSON; Senator MANNING JR (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Makes a hospital give to the OHA and make public on a website certain fiscal data. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.6).

Requires a hospital to report to the Oregon Health Authority and make publicly available securities data and disclosures that the hospital provides to the federal Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to the disclosure of financial information.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 442.
 - SECTION 2. (1) A hospital licensed in this state shall report to the Oregon Health Authority and make publicly available on the hospital's website securities data and disclosure documents that the hospital provides and makes publicly available on a website operated by the federal Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board established under 15 U.S.C. 780-4(b).
 - (2) A hospital shall report to the authority and make publicly available the information described under subsection (1) of this section:
 - (a) Within 24 hours of providing the information to the federal Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, or as frequently as required by the authority; and
 - (b) In a form and manner required by the authority.
 - (3) If a hospital does not have a website, the information described under subsection (1) of this section must be made available in hard copy form in each reception area of the hospital.
 - (4) The information that must be reported to the authority under this section is in addition to and not in lieu of the reporting requirements in ORS 442.386 or 442.425 or other similar provisions.
