Senate Bill 559

Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI, Representative CHOTZEN; Representative TRAN (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs BOPPPS to study early medical release for adults in custody. The Act goes into effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.7).

Requires the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to study changes to procedures for the early medical release of adults in custody. Directs the board to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to early medical release; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. The State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision shall study changes 5 to procedures for the early medical release of adults in custody. The board shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legis-6 lation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than September 15, 2026. 8 9 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027. SECTION 3. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 10 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 11
