1 Amend Bill, page 1, lines 6 through 18; page 2, lines 1  
2 through 4; by striking out all of said lines on said pages and  
3 inserting

4 Section 1. Section 1519(c) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania  
5 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by  
6 adding a subsection to read:

7 § 1519. Determination of incompetency.

9 (c) Recall [or suspension] of operating privilege.--The  
10 department shall recall the operating privilege of any person  
11 whose incompetency has been established under the provisions of  
12 this chapter or who refuses or fails to comply with the  
13 requirements of this section. The recall shall be for an  
14 indefinite period until that person complies and satisfactory  
15 evidence is presented to the department in accordance with  
16 regulations to establish that such person is competent to drive  
17 a motor vehicle. [The department shall suspend the operating  
18 privilege of any person who refuses or fails to comply with the  
19 requirements of this section until that person does comply and  
20 that person's competency to drive is established.] Any person  
21 aggrieved by the recall [or suspension] of the operating  
22 privilege may appeal in the manner provided in section 1550. The  
23 judicial review shall be limited to whether the person is  
24 competent to drive in accordance with the provisions of the  
25 regulations promulgated under section 1517 (relating to Medical  
26 Advisory Board).

27 (d) Vehicle lease termination on incompetency.--For a  
28 consumer lease of a motor vehicle subject to regulations of the  
29 consumer financial protection bureau under 12 CFR Ch. X Pt. 1013  
30 (relating to consumer leasing (Regulation M)), entered into  
31 after the effective date of this subsection, a lessee requesting  
32 early termination of a lease shall not be liable for any penalty  
33 or early termination charge provided by the lease if the vehicle  
34 lessee's operating privileges have been recalled under this  
35 section and no other member of the lessee's household regularly  
36 uses the vehicle. A lessee seeking to terminate a lease under  
37 this subsection must provide to the lessor a copy of the notice

1 of license recall provided by the department. The lease shall be  
2 terminated upon return of the vehicle to the lessor or other  
3 person in the manner provided by the lease, including in any  
4 amendment or lease assignment or notice.

5 Section 2. This act shall apply to leases for motor vehicles  
6 entered into with a lessee with a billing address located in  
7 this Commonwealth on or after the effective date of this  
8 section.

9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
