Data collection and reporting relating to traffic 20 stops. 21 (a) Data collection. -- Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a Pennsylvania State Police officer or a local police 22 23 officer shall collect, in a form and manner determined by the Pennsylvania State Police, the following information for any 24 self-initiated traffic stop made under this title as authorized 25 under section 6308 (relating to investigation by police_ 26 27 officers): (1) The reason for the traffic stop. 28 29 (2) The perceived race and ethnicity of the driver

4	(4) Whether a search was initiated, including a search

9	<u>(6) Whether the traffic stop or subsequent search</u>
10	resulted in a warning, citation, arrest or other action.
11	(7) Any additional information the Pennsylvania State

13	(b) Effect of failure to collect dataThe failure of a
14	<u>member of the Pennsylvania State Police or a local police</u>
15	officer to collect the data under subsection (a) shall not
16	affect the validity of the underlying traffic stop.
17	<u>(c) Report by local police departmentsOn an annual basis,</u>
18	<u>a local police department shall transmit the data collected</u>
19	<u>under subsection (a) by the local police officers employed by</u>
20	the local police department to the Pennsylvania State Police, or
21	<u>a third party designated by the Pennsylvania State Police with</u>
22	experience in the analysis of such data, for the preparation of
23	an annual analysis and report based on the data. Upon receipt of
24	the data, the Pennsylvania State Police or the third party shall
25	immediately make the annual analysis and report, including any
26	aggregate analysis of the data, publicly available by posting
27	the annual analysis and report on a publicly accessible Internet
28	website and transmit a copy of the annual analysis and report to

12	construed to prohibit data collected under this section from
13	being shared with organizations that compile national data
14	statistics. Data collected under subsection (a) shall not be
15	accessible under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3),
16	<u>known as the Right-to-Know Law.</u>
17	(h) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
18	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
19	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
20	"Local police department." A police department that is:
21	<u>(1) a regional police department that provides police</u>
22	<u>services to more than one municipality pursuant to an</u>
23	agreement or contract and serves a total population of more
24	<u>than 5,000 according to the 2020 Federal decennial census; or</u>
25	<u>(2) a municipal police department for a municipality</u>
26	with a population of more than 5,000 according to the 2020
27	<u>Federal decennial census.</u>
28	"Local police officer." An employee of a local police
29	department who is empowered to:
30	(1) Enforce 18 Pa.C.S. (relating to crimes and offenses)
31	and this title.
32	(2) Make traffic stops under section 6308.
33	"Self-initiated traffic stop." A traffic stop, regardless of
34	the outcome, that was initiated as a result of a reasonable
35	suspicion or probable cause of a violation of traffic or
36	<u>criminal law.</u>
37	Section 8. This act shall take effect as follows:
38	(1) This section shall take effect immediately.
39	(2) The addition of section 6329 of the act shall take
40	effect in 18 months.
41	(3) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 12
42	months.
