SUMMARY:

House Bill 2162 amends the act of May 28, 1937 (P.L. 955, No. 265), known as the Housing Authorities Law, to allow for the relocation of a tenant who is a victim of domestic violence, sexual violence, or other violence who resides in public housing authority property.

ANALYSIS:

This bill clarifies language throughout the Housing Authorities Law to allow relocation of a tenant who is a victim of domestic violence, sexual violence, or other violence. It outlines what an authority may request in instances of conflicting information and updates the timeframe from which the victimization occurred to request relocation from 90 days to 180 days from the date of the crime.

Finally, the bill updates definitions for “sexual violence” and “victim of other violence.”

This act would take effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill would have no impact on Commonwealth funds.
