DESCRIPTION

Senate Bill 1107 appropriates \$75,802,000 from the Workmen’s Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for administration of the Workers’ Compensation Act and the Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for Fiscal Year 2022-23. The fund is supported by annual assessments on insurers and self-insurers under the act.

Senate Bill 1107 appropriates \$350,000 from the restricted revenue account within the Workmen’s Compensation Administration Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Community and Economic Development for the operation of that office for Fiscal Year 2022-23.

This act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or immediately, whichever is later.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Senate Bill 1107 will cost the Workmen’s Compensation Administration Fund \$75,802,000 in Fiscal Year 2022-23. That funding amount is level with FY 2021-22.

Senate Bill 1107 will cost the Workmen’s Compensation Administration Fund \$350,000 in Fiscal Year 2022-23 for the operation of the Office of Small Business Advocate and is an increase of \$70,000 from FY 2021-22.
