## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; 2 providing for the licensing of nurses and for the revocation 3 and suspension of such licenses, subject to appeal, and for 4 their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such 5 licenses; regulating nursing in general; prescribing 6 penalties and repealing certain laws," further providing for fees and qualifications for licensure, for education 7 8 programs, approved lists, distribution and student credits 9 where school removed from list and for certified registered 10 11 nurse practitioners and qualifications. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Sections 6(a) and (b)(2) and (3), 6.2(c) and 15 8.1(b)(1)(i) of the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known 16 as The Professional Nursing Law, are amended to read: 17 Section 6. Fees; Qualifications for Licensure .-- (a) No 18 application for licensure as a registered nurse shall be 19 considered unless accompanied by a fee determined by the Board 20 by regulation. Every applicant, to be eligible for examination 21 for licensure as a registered nurse, shall furnish evidence 22 satisfactory to the Board that he or she is of good moral character, has completed work equal to a standard high school 23

- 1 course as evaluated by the Board and has satisfactorily
- 2 completed [an approved] a Board-approved program of professional
- 3 nursing accredited by an accrediting agency approved by the
- 4 <u>United States Department of Education</u>. Approved programs shall
- 5 include baccalaureate degree, associate degree, diploma nursing
- 6 programs and programs in transition from approved diploma- to
- 7 degree-granting programs when all other requirements of the
- 8 Board have been met.
- 9 (b) An applicant applying for licensure as a dietitian-
- 10 nutritionist shall submit a written application on forms
- 11 provided by the Board evidencing and insuring to the
- 12 satisfaction of the Board that the applicant:

- 14 (2) Has received a baccalaureate or higher degree from a
- 15 Board-approved[, regionally accredited] college or university
- 16 <u>accredited by an accrediting agency approved by the United</u>
- 17 States Department of Education, including a major course of
- 18 study in human nutrition, food and nutrition, dietetics or food
- 19 systems management.
- 20 (3) Has completed a planned continuous preprofessional
- 21 experience component in dietetic practice of not less than nine
- 22 hundred (900) hours under the supervision of a registered
- 23 dietitian, a dietitian-nutritionist licensed under this act or
- 24 an individual with a doctoral degree conferred by a [regionally
- 25 accredited] college or university accredited by an accrediting
- 26 agency approved by the United States Department of Education
- 27 <u>located</u> in the United States with a major course of study in
- 28 human nutrition, food and nutrition, nutrition education,
- 29 dietetics or food systems management as approved by the Board.

- 2 Distribution; Student Credits Where School Removed from List.--\*

- 4 (c) (1) Educational programs for the education of clinical
- 5 nurse specialists that are operated within a [regionally
- 6 accredited] college or university accredited by an accrediting
- 7 agency approved by the United States Department of Education and
- 8 where a master's degree, doctorate in nursing or a post-master's
- 9 degree is awarded, with a program concentration in the role of a
- 10 clinical nurse specialist, must be approved by [a national] an
- 11 accrediting [body] agency for nursing education programs
- 12 approved by the United States Department of Education recognized
- 13 by the board and shall be considered approved programs only for
- 14 the purposes of conferring certification to practice as a
- 15 clinical nurse specialist.
- 16 (2) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this
- 17 subsection, the board shall announce on its Internet website the
- 18 recognized [national] accrediting bodies for purposes of this
- 19 subsection.
- 20 (3) Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective
- 21 date of this subsection, education programs meeting these
- 22 requirements shall submit the name, address and telephone number
- 23 of the program; name and curriculum vitae of the program
- 24 director; and proof of accreditation to the board by [a
- 25 national] an accrediting [body] agency approved by the United
- 26 States Department of Education and recognized by the board for
- 27 inclusion on the list of approved clinical nurse specialist
- 28 education programs.
- 29 (4) Programs created more than six (6) months after the
- 30 effective date of this subsection shall submit the information

- 1 required in this subsection to the board for inclusion on the
- 2 list of approved programs.
- 3 Section 8.1. Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners;
- 4 Qualifications.--\* \* \*
- 5 (b) (1) Beginning on the effective date of this section, a
- 6 nurse shall not qualify for initial certification by the board
- 7 under subsection (a) unless the nurse:
- 8 (i) is a graduate of [an accredited,] <u>a</u> board-approved
- 9 master's or post-master's nurse practitioner program which is
- 10 <u>accredited by an accrediting agency approved by the United</u>
- 11 States Department of Education; and

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
