AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in professional employees, further 5 providing for definitions and providing for school clinical 6 mental health care providers; and establishing the school 7 mental and behavioral health care augmentation fund. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 1101(1) of the act of March 10, 1949 12 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 13 amended to read: 14 Section 1101. Definitions. -- As used in this article, 15 The term "professional employe" shall include those who 16 are certificated as teachers, supervisors, supervising 17 principals, principals, assistant principals, vice-principals, 18 directors of vocational education, dental hygienists, visiting teachers, home and school visitors, school clinical mental 19 health care providers, school counselors, child nutrition

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- 1 program specialists, school librarians, school secretaries the
- 2 selection of whom is on the basis of merit as determined by
- 3 eligibility lists and school nurses.

- 5 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 6 <u>Section 1106.1. School Clinical Mental Health Care</u>
- 7 Providers. -- (a) The board of school directors in every school
- 8 <u>district shall employ at least one school clinical mental health</u>
- 9 care provider. Any individual employed by a school district to
- 10 provide clinical mental health care services within a school
- 11 district must:
- 12 (1) maintain a valid license issued by the Pennsylvania
- 13 <u>Department of State's Bureau of Professional and Occupational</u>
- 14 Affairs to practice clinical mental health care in accordance
- 15 with the laws of this Commonwealth; or
- 16 (2) maintain a valid certificate or accreditation from a
- 17 national or State or recognized accreditation organization to
- 18 practice mental health care or behavioral health care in this
- 19 Commonwealth and hold a valid educational specialist
- 20 certificate.
- 21 (b) An individual who holds a valid State-issued license as
- 22 a clinical mental health care provider or holds a valid
- 23 educational specialist certificate for a mental or behavioral
- 24 health provider and is employed by a school district may use the
- 25 <u>title the individual is licensed or authorized to use under the</u>
- 26 laws of this Commonwealth.
- 27 <u>(c) The requirements of subsection (a)(1) and (2) shall not</u>
- 28 apply when the individual is employed in a mental health
- 29 <u>capacity in a public school in this Commonwealth prior to the</u>
- 30 development of a school clinical mental health care category

- 1 within the educational specialist certificate developed and
- 2 <u>issued by the department.</u>
- 3 (d) A certified school clinical mental health care provider
- 4 <u>employed in a school district may work under the supervision of</u>
- 5 the superintendent, assistant superintendent or other school
- 6 administrator or employee as determined by the school district.
- 7 (e) The department shall develop a school clinical mental
- 8 <u>health care category within the educational specialist</u>
- 9 <u>certificate no later than 120 days after the effective date of</u>
- 10 this section.
- 11 (f) When the school district determines that the
- 12 availability of certified or accredited mental or behavioral
- 13 <u>health providers is inadequate to serve the educational, social,</u>
- 14 emotional and general mental health needs of the school district
- 15 or that the loss of licensed clinical mental health care
- 16 providers due to early retirement would cause the interruption
- 17 of suitable and essential mental health care programs and
- 18 services, the school district may hire otherwise qualified
- 19 <u>individuals without current educational specialist certificates</u>,
- 20 provided that individuals employed shall enroll in an education
- 21 specialist program and meet the certification requirement of the
- 22 Commonwealth within a period not to exceed three (3) years.
- 23 (q) The School Mental and Behavioral Health Care Grant
- 24 Program is established to provide funding to enhance the
- 25 delivery of mental and behavioral health care in school
- 26 districts. The School Safety and Security Committee established
- 27 under section 1302-B shall perform all functions related to the
- 28 direct approval, disbursement and administration of grants under
- 29 the program.
- 30 (h) Each school district may submit one application under

- 1 subsection (q) annually and no school district may receive an
- 2 <u>annual grant allocation that exceeds 10% of the funds available</u>
- 3 under the program. No school district may receive a grant under
- 4 <u>subsection</u> (g) and section 1306-B for the same purposes.
- 5 <u>(i) The School Mental and Behavioral Health Care</u>
- 6 Augmentation Fund is established as a special nonlapsing fund in
- 7 the State Treasury. All money deposited in the fund and the
- 8 <u>interest the money accrues are appropriated on a continuing</u>
- 9 basis to award grants under this article. No administrative
- 10 action shall prevent the deposit of money into the fund in the
- 11 fiscal year in which the money is received.
- 12 (j) The fund may only be used for the grant program
- 13 <u>authorized under subsection (g) and no money in the fund may be</u>
- 14 transferred or diverted to any other purpose by administrative
- 15 <u>action. Money available to the fund shall include appropriations</u>
- 16 and transfers from Federal funds, including up to thirty million
- 17 dollars (\$30,000,000) from Federal funds received by the
- 18 Commonwealth for mental and behavioral health education and
- 19 training, the General Fund, special funds and other sources of
- 20 revenue made available to the fund.
- 21 (k) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 22 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 23 <u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 24 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 25 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 26 "Fund." The School Mental and Behavioral Health Care
- 27 <u>Augmentation Fund established under subsection (i).</u>
- 28 "Program." The School Mental and Behavioral Health Care
- 29 Grant Program established under subsection (g).
- 30 "School clinical mental health care provider." An individual

- 1 <u>licensed to practice the identification of psychosocial and</u>
- 2 behavioral problems in the context of significant interpersonal
- 3 relationships between students, individuals, families and groups
- 4 for the purpose of assessing, diagnosing and treating mental and
- 5 <u>behavioral health issues within the scope of the individual's</u>
- 6 <u>licensed practice. The term shall not include master level or</u>
- 7 bachelor level licensed social workers who are prohibited by law
- 8 <u>from assessing, diagnosing and developing treatment plans for</u>
- 9 clinical mental health care clients.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
