## AN ACT

- Establishing the Office of New Pennsylvanians and providing for its powers and duties; ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF NEW PENNSYLVANIANS RESTRICTED ACCOUNT; and establishing the Advisory Committee to Office of New Pennsylvanians and providing for its powers, duties and membership.

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- 1 Section 503. Powers and duties of advisory committee.
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- 4 Section <del>701</del> 702. Effective date.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 1
- 8 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
- 9 Section 101. Short title.
- 10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Office of New
- 11 Pennsylvanians Act.
- 12 Section 102. Legislative policy and declarations.
- 13 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 14 (1) According to the United States Census Bureau, in
- 2018, Pennsylvania ranked 42nd among the 50 states in
- population growth since 2010, increasing only 0.86%.
- 17 (2) In 2019, Pennsylvania's 893,167 foreign-born
- individuals comprised 7% of this Commonwealth's population,
- an increase of 75.7% since 2000, compared to only 1.2% growth
- in the United-States-born population.
- 21 (3) Throughout this Commonwealth's history, immigrants
- have played a critical role in this Commonwealth's economic,
- 23 cultural and political growth and success.
- 24 (4) Policies that promote the attraction, retention and
- inclusion of immigrants and refugees will help enhance this
- 26 Commonwealth's economy and diversity, thereby improving the
- 27 lives of all residents and helping to remove barriers that
- 28 may undermine immigrants' full potential.
- 29 (5) Immigrants currently fill skilled positions
- 30 throughout this Commonwealth's economy and are a vital part

- of this Commonwealth's economy and tax base. In 2019,
- 2 immigrant business owners in this Commonwealth generated more
- 3 than \$1,700,000,000 in business revenue and immigrant
- spending power increased to \$24,900,000,000.
- 5 (6) 40% of immigrants in this Commonwealth have a 6 bachelor of arts, bachelor of science or graduate degree,
- 7 compared to 32% of United-States-born Pennsylvanians.
- 8 (7) Organizations are providing leadership in this
  9 Commonwealth's immigrant integration efforts through programs
  10 and services that connect newcomers and longtime
- 11 Pennsylvanians to economic opportunity.

social, civic and cultural fabric.

- 12 (8) It is essential for this Commonwealth's future that
  13 skilled, energetic and entrepreneurial immigrants are
  14 attracted, retained and integrated. Immigrants help to
  15 bolster this Commonwealth's economy and strengthen the
- 17 States enforce and provide for many services, 18 licenses and educational and economic opportunities that make 19 it imperative to coordinate the work of state agencies, 20 leverage relationships with partner and nonprofit 21 organizations, and recommend policies and programs that 22 support immigrant inclusion. Immigrants on the path to full 23 civic and economic participation benefit from a welcoming 24 environment and policies that:
- 25 (i) Increase access to English language instruction 26 and workforce development and employment.
- 27 (ii) Reduce exploitation and fraud against 28 immigrants.
- 29 (iii) Connect new Pennsylvanians to legal services 30 and assist on the path to naturalization.

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- 1 (iv) Provide individuals with meaningful access to
- 2 Commonwealth resources and opportunities regardless of
- 3 English proficiency.
- 4 (10) In recognition of these facts and in promotion of
- 5 the stated goals, the creation of the Office of New
- 6 Pennsylvanians will help improve the lives and economic
- 7 prosperity of immigrants and Pennsylvanians generally.
- 8 Section 103. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Advisory committee." The Advisory Committee to Office of
- 13 New Pennsylvanians.
- 14 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 15 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 16 "Office." The Office of New Pennsylvanians.
- 17 "Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic
- 18 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 19 CHAPTER 3
- 20 OFFICE OF NEW PENNSYLVANIANS
- 21 Section 301. Establishment of office.
- 22 (A) ESTABLISHMENT. -- The Office of New Pennsylvanians is <--

- 23 established within the department.
- 24 (B) ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AND STAFF.--
- 25 (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES
- AND STAFF, INCLUDING COUNSEL AND LEGAL STAFF, TO THE OFFICE
- 27 AND TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
- 28 (2) THE OFFICE SHALL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE
- 29 COST AND EXPENSES OF PROVIDING THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES
- 30 AND STAFF UNDER PARAGRAPH (1). NO MORE THAN 5% OF THE FUNDING

- 1 APPROPRIATED ANNUALLY TO THE OFFICE SHALL BE USED FOR
- 2 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS AND EXPENSES.
- 3 Section 302. Powers and duties of office.
- 4 The office shall:
- 5 (1) Respond to inquiries from Commonwealth agencies, the
- 6 media, immigrant-serving organizations and the public about
- 7 immigration issues in this Commonwealth.
- 8 (2) Serve as point of contact for Commonwealth licensing
- 9 boards and the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 10 Affairs.
- 11 (3) Serve as an information clearinghouse for
- 12 Commonwealth agencies on immigration-related policy issues
- and coordinate among agencies as appropriate.
- 14 (4) Analyze economic, demographic and other trends
- impacting immigrants in this Commonwealth and make policy
- 16 recommendations.
- 17 (5) Ensure that the Commonwealth is gathering relevant
- 18 data to inform the Commonwealth's policy making on immigrant
- 19 issues.
- 20 (6) Develop strategies to attract, retain and integrate
- 21 immigrants into this Commonwealth.
- 22 (7) Convene stakeholders in business development and
- international trade promotion programs to increase capacity
- 24 to utilize immigrant contributors.
- 25 (8) Disseminate information to new and prospective
- 26 immigrant residents of this Commonwealth who wish to invest
- capital, launch businesses or apply their skills in this
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 (9) Convene municipal officials to boost peer learning
- 30 on increasing immigration in cities of the third class

- 1 struggling with population loss and economic decline.
- 2 (10) Convene college and university officials to foster 3 learning on strategies for immigrant and international
- student retention. 4

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- 5 (11) Provide matching grant funds for high-quality immigration and economic development programs that can 6 7 demonstrate corporate or philanthropic investment.
  - Disseminate information about available services to assist new and prospective immigrant residents of this Commonwealth on the path to naturalization.
    - Disseminate information about legal services available to new Pennsylvanians in civil legal matters, including housing, family, immigration and other matters.
  - Disseminate information about English language instruction and resources available to immigrant residents of this Commonwealth.
    - (15) Convene stakeholders in Commonwealth agencies, immigrant-serving organizations and the public to identify and reduce exploitation and fraud against immigrants.
    - (16) Convene stakeholders in Commonwealth agencies, immigrant-serving organizations and the public to promote race, sex, gender, age, income and LGBTQ equity and to identify and reduce inequities.
- Develop strategies to provide immigrants with meaningful access to Commonwealth resources and opportunities 26 regardless of their level of English proficiency.
- 27 (18) Communicate with Federal and international <--28 stakeholders to support the resettlement process for refugees-29 who have been identified for resettlement in this
- 30 Commonwealth.

- 1 (18) Evaluate the success of activities and adjust <--
- 2 courses as appropriate.
- 3 SECTION 303. OFFICE OF NEW PENNSYLVANIANS RESTRICTED ACCOUNT. <--
- 4 THE OFFICE OF NEW PENNSYLVANIANS RESTRICTED ACCOUNT IS
- 5 ESTABLISHED AS A RESTRICTED ACCOUNT IN THE GENERAL FUND. MONEY
- 6 APPROPRIATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR THE OFFICE SHALL BE
- 7 DEPOSITED IN THE RESTRICTED ACCOUNT FOR USE BY THE OFFICE TO
- 8 CARRY OUT ITS POWERS AND DUTIES UNDER SECTION 302.
- 9 CHAPTER 5
- 10 ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO
- 11 OFFICE OF NEW PENNSYLVANIANS
- 12 Section 501. Establishment of advisory committee.
- 13 The Advisory Committee to Office of New Pennsylvanians is
- 14 established within the office and shall serve in an advisory
- 15 capacity to the office in matters regarding immigrants in this
- 16 Commonwealth. The advisory committee shall be staffed and
- 17 administered by the office.
- 18 Section 502. Membership.
- 19 (a) Public official members. -- The advisory committee shall
- 20 consist of the following members, who shall serve by virtue of
- 21 their public position:
- 22 (1) The secretary or a designee.
- 23 (2) The Secretary of Administration or a designee.
- 24 (3) The Secretary of Education or a designee.
- 25 (4) The Secretary of Health or a designee.
- 26 (5) The Secretary of Human Services or a designee.
- 27 (6) The Secretary of Labor and Industry or a designee.
- 28 (7) The Secretary of Transportation or a designee.
- 29 (8) The Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police or a
- 30 designee.

- 1 (9) The Attorney General or a designee from the Office
- of the Attorney General, Bureau of Consumer Protection.
- 3 (b) Nongovernmental members. -- The advisory committee shall
- 4 consist of nongovernmental members to be appointed by the
- 5 Governor as follows:
- 6 (1) Three members from an organization that attracts,
- 7 retains and integrates immigrants into this Commonwealth's
- 8 economic, cultural and civic affairs. The advisory committee
- 9 shall establish a minimum of three regions within this
- 10 Commonwealth for the purpose of appointing one member from
- 11 each region.
- 12 (2) One member from a Pennsylvania chapter of the
- 13 American Immigration Lawyers Association.
- 14 (3) One member from an institution of higher education
- who has a primary focus on immigration issues.
- 16 (4) One member from the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business
- 17 and Industry or a similar local advocate for economic
- improvement.
- 19 (5) One member with expertise in promoting language
- 20 access plans.
- 21 (6) One member from an agency focused on providing
- 22 English language instruction to speakers of other languages.
- 23 (7) One member from the Pennsylvania banking sector.
- 24 (8) One member from a workforce training agency.
- 25 (9) One member from the health care sector.
- 26 (10) One member from an agency working to increase
- immigrants' access to health care services.
- 28 (11) One member from a human services agency.
- 29 (12) One member from a refugee resettlement agency.
- 30  $\frac{(13)}{(12)}$  One member from an agency focused on working <--

- 1 with immigrants in matters of tenants' rights.
- 2 (13) ONE MEMBER FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA MANUFACTURERS'
- <--

- 3 ASSOCIATION.
- 4 (c) Voting.--
- 5 (1) All members appointed shall hold voting privileges 6 on all matters brought for consideration before the advisory
- 7 committee.
- 8 (2) A simple majority of members with current
- 9 appointments to the advisory committee shall constitute a
- 10 quorum for the transaction of any business. An action adopted
- 11 by the majority of the members present at a meeting in which
- there is a quorum shall be deemed to be an act of the
- 13 advisory committee.
- 14 (d) Terms.--
- 15 (1) The terms of the members under subsection (a) shall
- be concurrent with their holding of the public office.
- 17 (2) A member appointed under subsection (b) shall serve
- 18 a three-year term as long as they represent the interest of
- the membership class for which they were appointed and shall
- 20 serve until a successor is appointed.
- 21 (e) Chairperson. -- The secretary shall serve as chairperson
- 22 of the advisory committee.
- 23 (f) Expenses of members.--Members of the advisory committee
- 24 shall receive no compensation for their services. Members who
- 25 are not employees of State government shall be reimbursed at
- 26 established Commonwealth rates for expenses incurred in the
- 27 performance of their duties on the advisory committee.
- 28 Section 503. Powers and duties of advisory committee.
- 29 (a) General rule. -- The advisory committee shall:
- 30 (1) Make recommendations to the Governor and the

- 1 secretary on policies, procedures, regulations and
- legislation to attract, retain and integrate immigrants into
- 3 this Commonwealth's society.
- 4 (2) Serve as the Governor's liaison to new
- 5 Pennsylvanians on policies, procedures, regulations and
- 6 legislation that affect immigrants, in order to ensure that
- 7 State government is accessible, accountable and responsive to
- 8 the needs of immigrants.
- 9 (3) Serve as a resource to all departments, commissions
- and agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction to ensure that
- 11 government entities are cognizant of the needs of immigrants
- and that the entities' respective services and programs are
- accessible to immigrants.
- 14 (4) Work with the office to monitor the practices of
- Commonwealth agencies relating to the attraction, retention
- and integration of immigrants in order to maximize the
- 17 efficiency and accessibility to State government.
- 18 (5) Perform other duties as the Governor and secretary
- may assign in planning for services and programs for
- 20 immigrants.
- 21 (b) Studies and reports. -- The advisory committee may conduct

- 22 studies and issue reports <del>upon request and</del> as necessary on
- 23 issues affecting immigrants in this Commonwealth.
- 24 (c) Public hearings. -- The advisory committee shall conduct
- 25 at least one public hearing each year to receive testimony and
- 26 public comments on improving the attraction, retention and
- 27 integration of immigrants in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (d) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall be
- 29 construed to prevent the advisory committee from establishing ad
- 30 hoc work groups or local committees to assist in research and

- 1 other duties necessary to carry out the mission of the office.
- 2 CHAPTER 7
- 3 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
- 4 SECTION 701. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER STATUTES. <--
- 5 THE FOLLOWING ACTS SHALL APPLY TO THE OFFICE AND THE ADVISORY
- 6 COMMITTEE:
- 7 (1) THE ACT OF JULY 19, 1957 (P.L.1017, NO.451), KNOWN
- 8 AS THE STATE ADVERSE INTEREST ACT.
- 9 (2) THE ACT OF FEBRUARY 14, 2008 (P.L.6, NO.3), KNOWN AS

- 10 THE RIGHT-TO-KNOW LAW.
- 11 (3) THE PROVISIONS OF 65 PA.C.S. CHS. 7 (RELATING TO
- 12 OPEN MEETINGS) AND 11 (RELATING TO ETHICS STANDARDS AND
- 13 FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE).
- 14 Section <del>701</del> 702. Effective date.
- 15 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
