AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 2 Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of aggravated assault. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2702(d) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended and subsection (c) is amended 7 8 by adding a paragraph to read: § 2702. Aggravated assault. 10 (c) Officers, employees, etc., enumerated. -- The officers, 11 12 agents, employees and other persons referred to in subsection 13 (a) shall be as follows: * * * 14 15 (39) A health care practitioner or technician. 16 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following

words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

- 2 "Electric or electronic incapacitation device." A portable
- 3 device which is designed or intended by the manufacturer to be
- 4 used, offensively or defensively, to temporarily immobilize or
- 5 incapacitate persons by means of electric pulse or current,
- 6 including devices operated by means of carbon dioxide
- 7 propellant. The term does not include cattle prods, electric
- 8 fences or other electric devices when used in agricultural,
- 9 animal husbandry or food production activities.
- "Emergency medical services personnel." The term includes,
- 11 but is not limited to, doctors, residents, interns, registered
- 12 nurses, licensed practical nurses, nurse aides, ambulance
- 13 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical
- 14 technicians and members of a hospital security force while
- 15 working within the scope of their employment.
- 16 <u>"Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the</u>
- 17 <u>act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care</u>
- 18 <u>Facilities Act.</u>
- 19 <u>"Technician." As defined in section 2 of the act of December</u>
- 20 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of
- 21 1985.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
