AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the COVID-19 Childcare for Essential Workers Grant
- 2 Program to provide grants to essential workers to be used for
- childcare during the COVID-19 disaster emergency; imposing
- duties on the Department of Community and Economic
- 5 Development; and providing for a transfer of Federal money.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19
- 10 Childcare for Essential Workers Grant Program Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Childcare." Care in lieu of parental care for part of a 24-
- 16 hour day by an eligible provider, as described in 55 Pa. Code §
- 17 3041.13(a) (relating to parent choice), or a relative of the
- 18 child who provides the care for the child if the relative

- 1 complies with the applicable State requirements for providing
- 2 the care.
- 3 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
- 4 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
- 5 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
- 6 China.
- 7 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 8 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 9 "Essential worker." An individual employed by or under
- 10 contract with a life-sustaining business or entity who worked
- 11 during the proclamation of disaster emergency and is engaged in
- 12 any of the following industries:
- 13 (1) Health care and social assistance.
- 14 (2) Food manufacturing or food retail facilities.
- 15 (3) Janitorial services to buildings and dwellings.
- 16 (4) Transit and ground passenger transportation.
- 17 (5) Security services for industries listed in this
- 18 definition.
- 19 (6) Commercial industries not closed during the
- 20 proclamation of disaster emergency.
- 21 "Proclamation of disaster emergency." The proclamation of
- 22 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 23 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
- 24 the state of disaster emergency.
- 25 "Program." The COVID-19 Childcare for Essential Workers
- 26 Program established under this act.
- 27 Section 3. Program.
- 28 (a) Establishment.--The COVID-19 Childcare for Essential
- 29 Workers Grant Program is established within the department.
- 30 (b) Duties of department. -- The department shall provide

- 1 grants under the program in accordance with this act to
- 2 essential workers adversely affected by COVID-19. Grants
- 3 provided under the program shall be used for childcare services.
- 4 Section 4. Application forms.
- 5 (a) Development. -- The department shall develop a grant
- 6 application form for applicants, including the following
- 7 information:
- 8 (1) Name, address, contact information and annual income
- 9 of the applicant.
- 10 (2) Name, address and contact information of the
- 11 applicant's employer.
- 12 (3) Name, age and childcare provider for each child of
- 13 the applicant.
- 14 (4) Current cost of childcare per month paid by the
- 15 applicant.
- 16 (5) Amount of grant money requested under the program.
- 17 (6) Any other information or documentation that the
- department deems necessary and appropriate.
- 19 (b) Submission. -- An applicant must submit the grant
- 20 application form and documentation required under subsection (a)
- 21 to the department in the manner prescribed by the department.
- 22 Section 5. Eligibility.
- 23 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in
- 24 subsection (b), grants may be awarded to essential workers.
- 25 (b) Exception.--Individuals who earn more than \$80,000 in
- 26 gross annual income per year or married couples who earn more
- 27 than \$120,000 in gross annual income per year shall not be
- 28 eligible for grants under this act.
- 29 Section 6. Applicability.
- 30 This act applies to childcare costs for children from birth

- 1 until the day prior to the date of the child's 14th birthday.
- 2 Children with disabilities 18 years of age or younger may be
- 3 eligible at the discretion of the department.
- 4 Section 7. Award of grants.
- 5 (a) Distribution of grants.--No later than 20 days after
- 6 receipt of the application form, the department shall make a
- 7 determination on the application and the amount to be awarded.
- 8 (b) Consideration. -- In determining grants to be awarded, the
- 9 department shall give priority to an applicant whose gross
- 10 annual income is less than \$35,000.
- 11 (c) Notice.--After making a determination under subsection
- 12 (a), the department shall provide written notice to the
- 13 applicant of the award amount or denial of the grant. Notice of
- 14 a grant award to an applicant shall include the amount of the
- 15 grant money awarded and all conditions or restrictions on the
- 16 use of the grant money. Notice of a denial, either in part or in
- 17 full, shall include the reasons for the denial.
- 18 Section 8. Guidelines.
- 19 The department may promulgate rules, regulations and
- 20 quidelines for the implementation and administration of the
- 21 program.
- 22 Section 9. Public notice.
- 23 (a) Availability of grants. -- The department shall provide
- 24 information regarding the availability of grants under the
- 25 program on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 26 website.
- 27 (b) Report.--Following the termination or expiration of the
- 28 proclamation of disaster emergency, the department shall post on
- 29 the department's publicly accessible Internet website the amount
- 30 of grant money awarded under the program.

- 1 Section 10. Limitation on award of grants.
- 2 Subject to the availability of funds, a grant to an applicant
- 3 shall not exceed \$750 per month per child.
- 4 Section 11. Appropriation.
- 5 The sum of \$50,000,000 is appropriated to the department on a
- 6 continuing basis from the COVID-19 Response Restricted Account
- 7 for the purposes of this act.
- 8 Section 12. Expiration.
- 9 (a) Notice.--Upon the expiration or termination of the
- 10 disaster emergency proclamation, the department shall transmit
- 11 notice of the expiration or termination of the program under
- 12 subsection (b) to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 13 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 14 (b) Authority. -- The authority of the department to award
- 15 grants under the program shall expire three months after the
- 16 publication of the notice required in subsection (a).
- 17 Section 13. Effective date.
- 18 This act shall take effect in 30 days.
