## AN ACT

- 1 (a) General rule.--As soon as practicable after the
- 2 determination of guilt and the examination of any presentence
- 3 report, a proceeding shall be held at which the court shall:

- 5 (3) Hear argument by the defense on the applicability of
- 6 the various sentencing alternatives to the facts of the case,
- 7 <u>including whether the defendant has been diagnosed with</u>
- 8 <u>posttraumatic stress disorder</u>, and may hear argument by the
