- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in human trafficking, further
- 3 providing for victim protection during prosecution.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3019(b) $\frac{1}{2}$ (D) AND (F) of Title <--
- 7 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to

- 9 § 3019. Victim protection during prosecution.

- 11 (b) Affirmative defense. -- [An individual who is charged with
- 12 any violation under section 5902 (relating to prostitution and
- 13 related offenses) may offer the defense at trial that he engaged
- 14 in the conduct charged because he was compelled to do so by
- 15 coercion or the use of or a threat to use unlawful force against
- 16 his person or the person of another, which a person of
- 17 reasonable firmness in his situation would have been unable to

- 1 resist.] A victim of human trafficking has an affirmative
- 2 defense for an offense committed as a direct result of the human
- 3 <u>trafficking without regard to whether any person was prosecuted</u>
- 4 or convicted for the human trafficking violation.

- 10 <u>CHECKS</u>), 5503 (relating to disorderly conduct), 5506
- 11 (relating to loitering and prowling at night time), 5507

- or 5902 <u>(relating to prostitution and related offenses)</u> or an
- offense for simple possession of a controlled substance OR AN <--
- ORDER OF CONTEMPT UNDER 42 PA.C.S. § 4132 (RELATING TO
- 16 ATTACHMENT AND SUMMARY PUNISHMENT FOR CONTEMPTS) RESULTING
- 17 FROM ANY OF THE ABOVE committed as a direct result of being a
- 18 victim of human trafficking may file a motion to vacate the

- 2 (F) GRANT OF MOTION. -- THE COURT SHALL GRANT THE MOTION IF IT
- 3 FINDS THAT:
- 4 (1) THE MOVING PARTY WAS CONVICTED OF AN OFFENSE
- 5 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (D) (1).
- 6 (2) THE MOVING PARTY DEMONSTRATES BY A PREPONDERANCE OF
- 7 THE EVIDENCE THAT THE CONVICTION WAS OBTAINED AS A RESULT OF
- 8 THE MOVING PARTY'S HAVING BEEN A VICTIM OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.
