AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; providing for the licensing of nurses and for the revocation 3 and suspension of such licenses, subject to appeal, and for 4 their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such 5 licenses; regulating nursing in general; prescribing 6 penalties and repealing certain laws," providing for Advanced Practice Registered Nurse. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known 11 12 as The Professional Nursing Law, is amended by adding a section 13 to read: Section 8.10. Advanced Practice Registered Nurse. -- (a) The 14 15 Board shall issue to each person who meets the following 16 criteria a certificate setting forth that the person is 17 certified as an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse: 18 (1) the person holds a master's degree or post-master's
- 19 degree; and

- 1 (2) the person is licensed in one of the following
- 2 classifications:
- 3 (i) Certified Registered Nurse Practitioner (C.R.N.P.).
- 4 (ii) Clinical Nurse Specialist (C.N.S.).
- 5 (iii) Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (C.R.N.A.).
- 6 (b) A person who is certified by the Board under subsection
- 7 (a) is entitled to use the title "Advanced Practice Registered
- 8 Nurse" and the letters "A.P.R.N." A record of each person
- 9 <u>certified as an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse in this</u>
- 10 Commonwealth shall be kept in the office of the Board and posted
- 11 on the Board's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
