The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The definition of "oral communication" in section
5702 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is
amended to read:
§ 5702. Definitions.
As used in this chapter, the following words and phrases
shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
context clearly indicates otherwise:
* * *
"Oral communication." Any oral communication uttered by a
person possessing an expectation that such communication is not
subject to interception under circumstances justifying such
expectation. The term does not include the following:

(1) An electronic communication.

2 (2) A communication made in the presence of a law 3 enforcement officer on official duty who is in uniform or otherwise clearly identifiable as a law enforcement officer 4 5 and who is using an electronic, mechanical or other device 6 which has been approved under section 5706(b)(4) (relating to 7 exceptions to prohibitions in possession, sale, distribution, 8 manufacture or advertisement of electronic, mechanical or 9 other devices) to intercept the communication in the course 10 of law enforcement duties. As used in this paragraph only, "law enforcement officer" means a member of the Pennsylvania 11 12 State Police, an individual employed as a police officer who 13 holds a current certificate under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D 14 (relating to municipal police education and training), a sheriff or a deputy sheriff[.] or an agent under 61 Pa.C.S. § 15 6183 (relating to exception to prohibition of interception 16 17 and disclosure of communications). * * * 18 19 Section 2. Title 61 is amended by adding a section to read: § 6183. Exception to prohibition of interception and disclosure 20 21 of communications. 22 An agent who has received training on the use of an 23 electronic, mechanical or other device that has been approved 24 under 18 Pa.C.S. § 5706(b)(4) (relating to exceptions to prohibitions in possession, sale, distribution, manufacture or 25 26 advertisement of electronic, mechanical or other devices) in a 27 course approved by the Pennsylvania State Police shall be an

28 investigative or law enforcement officer as defined under 18

29 Pa.C.S. § 5702 (relating to definitions). The agent may wear an

30 electronic, mechanical or other device in the performance of

1 official duties.

2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
