3 <u>§ 11001. Scope of chapter.</u>

4 <u>This chapter relates to the Pennsylvania Food Bucks Program.</u>

5 <u>§ 11002.</u> Declaration of purpose.

6 The General Assembly finds and declares that the purpose of

7 this chapter is to establish the Pennsylvania Food Bucks Program

8 as a benefit incentive program for Supplemental Nutrition

9 Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients to purchase eligible fruits

10 and vegetables at eligible food retailers.

11 <u>§ 11003.</u> Definitions.

12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

14 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>

15 "Account." The Pennsylvania Food Bucks Program Account

16 established under section 11006(a) (relating to establishment of 17 account).

18 "Benefit incentive." The financial or benefit reward for a

19 SNAP recipient when the SNAP recipient purchases an eligible

20 fruit or vegetable at an eligible food retailer as determined by

21 the grantee.

22 <u>"Eligible food retailer." A SNAP-authorized site or food</u>

23 vendor. The term may include a farmer's market, corner store,

24 grocery store or supermarket that redeems SNAP benefits.

25 <u>"Eligible fruit or vegetable." A fruit or vegetable that</u>

26 meets the criteria specified in the definition of "food" in 7

27 U.S.C. § 2012(k) (relating to definitions). The term may include

28 <u>a fruit or vegetable whether fresh, canned, dried or frozen</u>

29 whole or cut without added sugars, fats, oils or salt.

30 "Grantee." A Pennsylvania nonprofit organization that

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1	<u>qualifies for an exemption from taxation under 26 U.S.C. §</u>
2	501(c)(3) (relating to exemption from tax on corporations,
3	certain trusts, etc.) selected by the department to administer
4	the program under section 11005(b) (relating to administration
5	<u>of program).</u>
6	"Program." The Pennsylvania Food Bucks Program established
7	under section 11004 (relating to establishment of program).
8	"SNAP." The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
9	established under 7 U.S.C. Ch. 51 (relating to Supplemental
10	Nutrition Assistance Program).
11	<u>§ 11004. Establishment of program.</u>
12	The Pennsylvania Food Bucks Program is established within the
13	department.
14	<u>§ 11005. Administration of program.</u>
15	(a) AdministrationThe grantee selected by the department
16	under subsection (b) shall administer the program for a period
17	<u>of no less than two years.</u>
18	(b) Selection of granteeThe department shall develop
19	eligibility criteria and an application process to select a
20	grantee, who shall meet all of the following criteria:
21	(1) Has demonstrated success in administering healthy
22	food incentive programming.
23	(2) Is able to apply for a Federal large-scale project
24	grant under the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (Public
25	Law 115-334, 132 Stat. 4490) through the Gus Schumacher
26	Nutrition Incentive Program.
27	(c) Program guidelinesThe grantee, in conjunction with
28	the department, shall develop and establish program standards
29	and incentive criteria for the program, including all of the
30	following requirements:

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1	(1) The mechanism for delivering benefit incentives	
2	under the program shall be determined by the grantee in	
3	consultation with eligible food retailers.	
4	(2) The grantee shall provide a benefit incentive of no	
5	less than 40¢ to a SNAP recipient for every \$1 of SNAP	
6	benefits redeemed by the SNAP recipient on eligible fruits or	
7	vegetables at eligible food retailers.	
8	(d) Program evaluationThe grantee shall evaluate the	
9	program on a biennial basis and post a report with the findings	
10	of the evaluation on a publicly accessible Internet website and	
11	submit the report to the department and the General Assembly.	
12	The grantee shall include all of the following information in	
13	the report:	
14	(1) The amount of money used for benefit incentives.	
15	(2) The geographic distribution and amount of money	
16	dispersed at the county level.	
17	(3) A list of each participating eligible food retailer.	
18	<u>§ 11006. Establishment of account.</u>	
19	<u>(a) Establishment of accountThe Pennsylvania Food Bucks</u>	
20	Program Account is established as a restricted account in the	
21	General Fund and shall be used exclusively for the program in	
22	accordance with this chapter. Money in the account is	
23	appropriated on a continuing basis to the department for the	
24	purposes of this chapter.	
25	(b) Supplements to accountIn addition to money	
26	appropriated to the department for the program, the department	
27	may also accept gifts, donations, legacies and other revenues,	
28	including Federal appropriations, for deposit into the account.	
29	<u>§ 11007. Use of available money for program.</u>	
30	The grantee shall use money available for the program for the	
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1 <u>following purposes:</u>

2	(1) Distributing money to partner organizations or
3	directly to SNAP recipients for purchasing eligible fruits or
4	vegetables at eligible food retailers.
5	(2) Implementing and evaluating the program. The grantee
6	may only use 40% of the available money for the program in a
7	fiscal year for the purpose specified under this paragraph.
8	(3) Matching contributions for additional Federal, local
9	or private sources, including money or in-kind contributions.
10	<u>§ 11008. Regulations.</u>
11	The department may promulgate regulations to implement this
12	<u>chapter.</u>
13	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 120 days.

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
