1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in the Adjutant General, further providing for appointment of Adjutant General, deputies and assistants and for general powers and duties of Adjutant General; in State Veterans' Commission and Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs, further providing for State Veterans' Commission, for Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs, for qualifications and status, for specific duties and for accreditation; in veterans' organizations, further providing for grants to veterans' service officer programs; and making editorial changes.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. Sections 901(a) and 902 introductory paragraph
15	and (12), Chapter 17 heading, section 1702(b)(1) and (2)
16	introductory paragraph, (c) and (e), Subchapter B heading of
17	Chapter 17 and sections 1711, 1712, 1731(c)(5)(i) and (d)
18	introductory paragraph and 9304(h) introductory paragraph and
19	(j) of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are
20	amended to read:
21	§ 901. Appointment of Adjutant General, deputies and

assistants.

2 Appointment. -- The Governor shall appoint the Adjutant (a) 3 General with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Adjutant General may appoint a Deputy Adjutant General for Army and a 4 5 Deputy Adjutant General for Air, and such other <u>Deputy</u> 6 Secretaries, Deputy Adjutants General and Assistant Adjutants 7 General as in [his] the Adjutant General's discretion are needed 8 for the efficient functioning of the department. The positions of Assistant Adjutant General, Army, and Assistant Adjutant 9 10 General, Air, in the grades of brigadier general or major 11 general, shall be authorized. Deputy Adjutants General and such 12 additional Assistant Adjutants General as may be required may 13 also have at least the rank of brigadier general in the 14 Pennsylvania National Guard or Pennsylvania Guard after 15 appointment.

17 § 902. General powers and duties of Adjutant General.

18 The Adjutant General as head of the department is responsible 19 to the Commonwealth and to the Governor for the organization and 20 functioning of said department, and the performance and carrying 21 out of all the duties, powers and responsibilities given or 22 delegated. In addition [he] <u>the Adjutant General</u> is hereby 23 authorized and directed to:

(12) Appoint a Deputy [Adjutant General] <u>Secretary</u> for
Veterans' Affairs, who shall serve as the Director of the
Bureau for Veterans' Affairs.

12	(c) OfficersThe commission shall annually elect a
13	[chairman] <u>chairperson</u> and vice [chairman] <u>chairperson</u> at the
14	first meeting of the commission after October 1. The Deputy
15	[Adjutant General] <u>Secretary</u> for Veterans' Affairs shall serve
16	as the executive secretary to the commission.

18	(e) Meetings and quorumThe commission shall meet upon the
19	call of the [chairman] chairperson or the Adjutant General. Nine
20	members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

25	§ 1711. Qualifications and status.
26	(a) Deputy [Adjutants General] <u>Secretary</u> In addition to
27	such other Deputy Adjutants General as may be named in the
28	department, there shall be a Deputy [Adjutant General] Secretary
29	for Veterans' Affairs, who shall perform the duties under
30	section 1712 (relating to specific duties) and such other duties
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1 as the Adjutant General may assign.

2	[(h) Apprintment The Deputy Adjutent Conevel for Metersonal
	[(b) AppointmentThe Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans'
3	Affairs shall be selected and appointed as other Deputy
4	Adjutants General are selected and appointed. He shall be a
5	veteran and an active member of at least one of the veterans'
6	organizations listed under section 1702(b) (relating to State
7	Veterans' Commission).]
8	(b) AppointmentThe Deputy Secretary for Veterans' Affairs
9	shall be selected and appointed by the Adjutant General. To be
10	eligible for appointment under this subsection, the individual
11	<u>must:</u>
12	(1) Be a veteran of the armed forces of the United
13	States, which shall include the National Guard of any state
14	or territory of the United States and other reserve
15	components of the United States military.
16	(2) Have demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the
17	Adjutant General, successful executive leadership in an
18	organization.
19	(3) Have attained the necessary educational requirements
20	to fulfill the requirements of the position as determined by
21	the Adjutant General.
22	(4) Have experience with services and benefits for
23	veterans or experience working in a nonprofit setting
24	providing outreach services or long-term care.
25	(5) Have any other qualifications as the Adjutant
26	General may deem necessary to fulfill the duties outlined in
27	section 1712 (relating to specific duties).
28	(c) CompensationThe compensation of the Deputy [Adjutant
29	General] <u>Secretary</u> for Veterans' Affairs shall be as established
30	by law.

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1 [(d) Status. -- The Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs shall be accorded all the rights, emoluments and 2 privileges, except pay and allowances, of a brigadier general in 3 the Pennsylvania Guard and shall be addressed as "General."] 4 § 1712. Specific duties. 5

In addition to such other duties as may be provided by law or 6 7 as assigned by the Adjutant General, the Deputy [Adjutant 8 General] Secretary for Veterans' Affairs shall have the 9 following specific duties:

To recommend to the Adjutant General and the 10 (1)Governor, with the advice of the State Veterans' Commission, 11 12 new legislation and amendments to existing statutes 13 concerning veterans and their activities for consideration by 14 the General Assembly.

15 To cooperate with all Federal and State departments (2)16 and agencies in the interest of veterans.

17 To aid in filing and prosecuting claims of (3) 18 Pennsylvania's veterans and their dependents under Federal or 19 State laws or regulations.

20 To aid veterans in seeking employment or (4) 21 reemployment after their honorable discharge from the armed 22 forces of the United States.

23 (5) To aid veterans requiring medical care in securing 24 hospitalization provided by a Federal or State medical or 25 care facility.

26 To aid in the rehabilitation of injured, wounded or (6) 27 compensable veterans in educational institutions or vocational training institutions for which they may be 28 29 eligible by law.

30 To cooperate with and advise the Department of (7) 20240HB2417PN3669

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Education with respect to vocational training programs for
 veterans, particularly programs suited to casualties.

3 (8) To administer relief provided by the Commonwealth4 for veterans and their dependents.

5 (9) To administer the distribution under the direction 6 of the Adjutant General of any compensation to veterans or 7 their dependents that has been or may be granted by the 8 Commonwealth.

9 (10) To investigate the work of other State agencies in 10 administering laws affecting veterans and their dependents.

11 (11) To investigate, compile and maintain complete and 12 accurate data concerning veterans of the armed forces of the 13 United States and all State and municipal activities related 14 thereto.

15 (12) To compile from the records transmitted from the 16 various counties of this Commonwealth a record of the burial 17 places in this Commonwealth of deceased veterans, including 18 such information as the Deputy [Adjutant General] <u>Secretary</u> 19 for Veterans' Affairs or [his] <u>a</u> designee deems necessary and 20 appropriate.

(13) To disseminate information concerning
Pennsylvania's veterans and Pennsylvania's veterans' programs
to veterans' organizations, to the public press and other
media and to the general public.

(14) To biannually submit, through the Adjutant General,
to the Governor a report of State activities on behalf of
veterans.

(15) To serve as a clearinghouse for all problems or
issues related to Pennsylvania's veterans and their
dependents.

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1 (16)To serve as Executive Secretary of the State 2 Veterans' Commission. § 1731. Accreditation. 3 4 * * * 5 (c) Additional duties. -- In addition to the duties provided for under a statute other than this title, a director of 6 7 veterans affairs shall do all of the following: * * * 8 9 (5) Participate in programs provided by the department, 10 including: 11 Annual training and refresher courses provided (i) 12 by the Office of the Deputy [Adjutant General] Secretary 13 for Veterans' Affairs. 14 * * * 15 (d) Office duties. -- The Office of the Deputy [Adjutant 16 General] Secretary for Veterans' Affairs shall establish a county director of veterans affairs training program, agreed 17 18 upon with the State Association of County Directors of Veterans 19 Affairs, which shall include the following: 20 * * * 21 § 9304. 5 Audits.--The department or the Auditor General may (j) conduct such audits and reviews of the grant program hereby 6 7 established as the department or the Auditor General determines 8 to be necessary or appropriate. Copies of all audit reports or reviews conducted by the department or the Auditor General shall 9 be made available to the [chairman] chairperson and minority 10 [chairman] chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency 11 12 Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the [chairman] 13 chairperson and minority [chairman] chairperson of the Veterans 14 Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the House of 15 Representatives.
