AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for school facilities; establishing the School Facilities Office and the Public School Facility Advisory Committee; and repealing provisions relating to building condition assessments.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
12	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
13	article to read:
14	ARTICLE VII-A
15	SCHOOL FACILITIES
16	Section 701-A. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this article
18	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
19	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>
20	"Committee." The Public School Facility Advisory Committee

- 2 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 <u>"Office." The School Facilities Office established under</u>
- 5 <u>section 702-A(a).</u>
- 6 "Public school facility." A structure, building or facility
- 7 used wholly or in part by a school entity, intermediate unit or
- 8 cyber charter school for academic purposes or administrative
- 9 <u>support.</u>
- 10 "School entity." A school district, area career and
- 11 <u>technical school</u>, <u>charter school or regional charter school</u>
- 12 <u>operating within this Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 Section 702-A. School Facilities Office.
- 14 (a) Establishment.--The School Facilities Office is
- 15 <u>established within the department.</u>
- 16 (b) Duties. -- The office shall have the following duties:
- 17 (1) Assist school entities with assessing their
- 18 infrastructure needs to provide quality, safe, healthy,
- 19 sustainable, effective and equitable learning environments.
- 20 (2) Assist school entities with securing and leveraging
- 21 <u>Federal, State and local resources to improve public school</u>
- 22 facilities.
- 23 (3) Coordinate public school facility planning and
- improvement across agencies.
- 25 (4) Provide technical assistance regarding school
- infrastructure improvement to high-need school districts as
- 27 <u>determined by the office.</u>
- 28 (5) Offer professional development to school entity
- leaders.
- 30 (6) Administer the department's responsibilities for all

- 1 <u>associated grants, reimbursements, approvals and reviews</u>
- 2 <u>under the following:</u>
- 3 (i) Article VII.
- 4 (ii) Article XXVI-J.
- 5 (iii) Article XXVI-L.
- 6 (7) Establish and maintain the public school facility
- 7 <u>inventory required under section 703-A(c).</u>
- 8 (8) Develop, in consultation with the committee
- 9 established under section 704-A(a), the criteria for the
- 10 Statewide facility assessment required under section 705-A(b)
- 11 (1).
- 12 (9) Contract with one or more third-party vendors to
- 13 <u>complete the Statewide facility assessment required under</u>
- 14 <u>section 705-A(b)(1).</u>
- 15 (c) Administrative costs. -- The department may use up to 1%
- 16 of money appropriated for grants or reimbursement of school
- 17 construction projects to support administrative costs for the
- 18 office.
- 19 Section 703-A. Public school facility inventory.
- 20 (a) Data submission. -- No later than February 1, 2025, the
- 21 department shall establish a form and electronic process by
- 22 which each school entity, intermediate unit or cyber charter
- 23 school can submit the information required under subsection (c).
- (b) Duties. -- No later than April 1, 2025, each school
- 25 entity, intermediate unit or cyber charter school shall submit
- 26 the information required under subsection (c) to the department
- 27 in a form and manner determined by the department.
- 28 (c) Inventory. -- For each public school facility, the
- 29 department shall collect the following information from a school
- 30 entity, intermediate unit or cyber charter school:

1	(1) The name of the school entity, intermediate unit or
2	cyber charter school that uses the public school facility.
3	(2) The name or address of the public school facility.
4	(3) The grades served in the public school facility, if
5	applicable.
6	(4) The number of students enrolled in the public school
7	facility, if applicable.
8	(5) Whether the public school facility is an
9	administrative building.
10	(6) The number of stories in the public school facility.
11	(7) The size of the public school facility in square
12	footage, including total square footage and the square
13	footage of the building's roof.
14	(8) The acreage of the public school facility site.
15	(9) The ownership status of the public school facility,
16	including the following:
17	(i) Owned by the school entity, intermediate unit or
18	cyber charter school.
19	(ii) Leased to the school entity, intermediate unit
20	or cyber charter school, including an indicator of
21	whether the school entity, intermediate unit or cyber
22	charter school is financially responsible for routine and
23	preventative facility maintenance costs.
24	(iii) Other status.
25	(10) The age of the public school facility, if known,
26	including dates and brief descriptions of any major
27	renovations.
28	(d) Technical assistance The department shall provide
29	technical assistance to each school entity, intermediate unit or
30	cyber charter school to ensure a complete inventory under

- 2 (e) Annual update. -- Beginning in the 2025-2026 school year
- 3 and each school year thereafter, the department shall prompt
- 4 <u>each school entity</u>, intermediate unit or cyber charter school to
- 5 review and update the information under subsection (c) as
- 6 <u>necessary.</u>
- 7 (f) Public posting. -- The department shall maintain the
- 8 <u>information under subsection (c) on the department's publicly</u>
- 9 <u>accessible Internet website in a searchable and sortable format.</u>
- 10 Section 704-A. Public School Facility Advisory Committee.
- 11 (a) Establishment. -- The Public School Facility Advisory
- 12 <u>Committee is established within the office.</u>
- 13 (b) Duties.--The committee shall have the following duties:
- 14 (1) Make recommendations to the office pertaining to
- 15 <u>public school facility issues, including program</u>
- 16 <u>requirements, guidelines, funding structures, regulations and</u>
- support provided by the department.
- 18 (2) Periodically review the maintenance of the public
- 19 <u>school building inventory under section 703-A(c) and provide</u>
- 20 recommendations to the office regarding the maintenance of
- 21 <u>the inventory.</u>
- 22 (3) Work in consultation with the office on developing
- 23 <u>uniform criteria and measures for the Statewide facility</u>
- 24 condition assessment required under section 705-A(b)(1).
- 25 (4) Make recommendations to the office and General
- Assembly on how to ensure that each school entity addresses
- 27 <u>deficiencies identified in the Statewide facility condition</u>
- 28 assessment required under section 705-A(b)(1), including, if
- applicable, the best use of the rating scale developed under
- 30 section 705-A(a)(2).

1 (c) Composition. -- The committee shall consist of the 2 following members: (1) The division chief for the office. 3 (2) An individual appointed by the President pro tempore 4 5 of the Senate. 6 (3) An individual appointed by the Speaker of the House 7 of Representatives. 8 (4) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of 9 the Senate. 10 (5) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of 11 the House of Representatives. 12 (6) The executive director of the State Public School 13 Building Authority. 14 (7) Two individuals recommended by the Pennsylvania Association of School Business Officials with experience in 15 16 school facility operations. 17 (8) An individual recommended by the Pennsylvania 18 Association of School Administrators. 19 (9) An architect recommended by the American Institute 20 of Architects of Pennsylvania with experience in school 21 building projects. 22 (10) An engineer recommended by the Pennsylvania Society 23 of Professional Engineers with experience in school building 24 projects. 25 (11) An individual recommended by the Pennsylvania State 26 Building and Construction Trades Council. 27 (12) An individual jointly recommended by the Pennsylvania State Education Association and the American 28 29 Federation of Teachers Pennsylvania. (13) A public health official recommended by the 30

2	(14) An individual recommended by the chairperson of the
3	Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency.
4	(d) Meetings
5	(1) The committee shall meet at the call of the division
6	chief for the office.
7	(2) The committee shall hold its first meeting within 15
8	days of the effective date of this paragraph.
9	(e) Compensation The members of the committee shall serve
10	without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their necessary
11	expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties.
12	Section 705-A. Statewide facility condition assessment.
13	(a) Development
14	(1) No later than May 1, 2025, the office, in
15	consultation with the committee, shall develop a uniform set
16	of criteria and measures for evaluating the physical
17	attributes and educational suitability of each school
18	entity's facilities for the purposes of a Statewide facility
19	condition assessment under subsection (b). The following
20	<pre>shall apply:</pre>
21	(i) The physical attributes shall include all of the
22	<pre>following:</pre>
23	(A) Structural components, including walls,
24	floors, roofs, windows and doors.
25	(B) System components, including mechanical,
26	electrical, plumbing and heating, ventilation and air
27	<pre>conditioning.</pre>
28	(C) Interior components, including finishes and
29	<u>fixtures.</u>
30	(D) Exterior components, including finishes and

1	<u>fixtures.</u>
2	(ii) The evaluation may include a record of recently
3	completed and scheduled major maintenance projects
4	specified under section 2604-J(b).
5	(2) No later than May 1, 2025, the office, in
6	consultation with the committee, may develop a rating scale
7	to determine the relative physical condition of each public
8	school facility.
9	(b) Assessment
10	(1) No later than June 1, 2025, the office shall
11	initiate a process to contract with a third-party vendor to
12	complete a Statewide facility condition assessment of each
13	public school facility using the criteria and measures
14	developed by the office under subsection (a). The assessment
15	may be completed in phases.
16	(2) Subject to available funding and notwithstanding
17	section 2602-L, the department may use up to \$10,000,000 in
18	the 2024-2025 fiscal year and \$10,000,000 in the 2025-2026
19	fiscal year from money in the School Environmental Repairs
20	Program Restricted Account to finance the Statewide facility
21	condition assessment.
22	Section 2. Section 2605-J of the act is repealed:
23	[Section 2605-J. Building condition assessments.
24	(a) Duties of department
25	(1) The department shall develop guidelines for school
26	entities to voluntarily report information related to school
27	building safety, inventory and condition. The guidelines
28	shall include a building condition assessment to be
29	voluntarily completed every 10 years for school entities that
30	includes, but is not limited to, a projection of costs to

- 1 maintain and renovate existing school buildings.
- 2 (2) The department shall post completed building 3 condition assessments on the department's publicly accessible
- 4 Internet website.
- 5 (3) The department shall provide additional points under
- the funding rubric contained in section 2604-J(d) for grants
- applied for by school entities that complete building
- 8 condition assessments.
- 9 (b) Completion incentive. -- A school entity that completes a
- 10 building condition assessment shall receive a 2% increase above
- 11 the amount calculated under section 2606-J. The department shall
- 12 develop a process, in coordination with the application process
- in section 2602-J, for awarding an enhanced reimbursement for
- 14 completing a building condition assessment.]
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
